Buckley AFB continues to work with FWS and the State of Colorado to update its endangered species lists and is required to evaluate the potential effects ~~affects~~ of every new construction project through a formal environmental impact analysis. These analyses require that all new projects are designed and maintained such that the existence of listed species cannot be jeopardized and critical habitat cannot be adversely modified or destroyed.

No species that are federally-listed as endangered or threatened ("listed") under the Endangered Species Act (ESA) have been found or are expected to be present on Buckley AFB. According to the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service there is no critical habitat designated on or near Buckley AFB. Therefore, plans to address impacts from stormwater discharges are not applicable. The burrowing owl is a Colorado state threatened species of concern. Historically, burrowing owls have occupied habitat on Buckley AFB and are monitored regularly.
