## ORDER GRANTING THIRD MOTION FOR STAY OF PROCEEDINGS

÷

On October 20, 2005, Region I of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency filed a status report and motion to extend the stay of the proceedings in the above-captioned matter, which currently extends through November 1, 2005. Counsel for Region I reports that petitioners Timothy A. Watts and Douglas H. Watts assent to the status report and motion. In its motion, Region I reports that the parties remain actively engaged in settlement discussions and continue to believe there is a substantial likelihood that the issues raised in the petition can be resolved without resort to litigation.

At present, the parties are still exploring the possibility of establishing an in-stream water quality monitoring program for the Salisbury Plain and Taunton Rivers to assess the impacts of the wastewater facility's discharges on receiving waters. Petitioners have agreed to withdraw their petition if a monitoring program is adopted and if the permittee (the City of Brockton, Massachusetts) commits to utilizing ultraviolet light rather than chlorine to treat the facility's effluent. In its latest motion, Region I reports that the permittee has indicated its willingness to implement ultraviolet disinfection, but that it recently raised the prospect of pursuing an alternative to the in-stream water quality study, which would be a regional wastewater planning study. The Region suggests that further time is needed to resolve these issues to the satisfaction of the petitioners, the permittee, and the Region and therefore seeks a sixty-day extension in the stay of the permit appeal proceedings before the Environmental Appeals Board.

For good cause shown, the Region's motion is hereby **GRANTED**. The parties are hereby directed to provide the Board with a report, on or before **Monday**, **January 9**, 2006, describing the status of settlement negotiations in this case and suggesting a future course of action.
