#### Motion for Extension of Time and Stay of Proceedings

#### CONDITIONS SPECIFIC TO EASLEY COMBINED UTIL/MIDDLE BRANCH WWTP -NPDES PERMIT SC0039853 Modification/REISSUANCE

- Page I-2, Limitations for Total Recoverable Nickel should also be in terms of mass. A mass limit
  of 1.63 pounds/day for a monthly average and a 3.27 pounds/day weekly average should be
  specified [this is based on a design flow of 3.5 MGD and the specified concentration limits of
  0.056 mg/l and 0.112 mg/l].
- 2. Page I-2, Monitoring and reporting for Total Recoverable Copper should also be in terms of mass.
- 3. Please include the following paragraph in Part III of the permit:

"For the purposes of identification of the treatment capacity (under R61-67.300.A.8); for a determination of whether or not a POTW is required to develop a pretreatment program (under R.61-9.403.a); and for NPDES billing (under R61-30.2.b), the "actual flow" limit for the Easley MiddleBranch wastewater treatment facility shall be identified as the design flow of 3.5 MGD."

 If there are any changes made to the NPDES permit modification/reissuance made after the EPA Region IV request for State Certification dated March 26, 2007, they would require SCDHEC review and certification.
