## **PURPOSE**

There are two purposes for this memorandum.

The first is to transmit the <u>Interim Guidance on the</u>
<u>Determination and Use of Water-Effect Ratios for Metals</u>. EPA
committed to developing this guidance to support implementation
of federal standards for those States included in the National
Toxics Rule.

The second is to provide policy guidance on whether a State's application of a water-effect ratio is a site-specific criterion adjustment subject to EPA review and approval/disapproval.

## BACKGROUND

In the early 1980's, members of the regulated community expressed concern that EPA's laboratory-derived water quality criteria might not accurately reflect site-specific conditions because of the effects of water chemistry and the ability of species to adapt over time. In response to these concerns, EPA created three procedures to derive site-specific criteria. These procedures were published in the <u>Water Ouality Standards</u> Handbook, 1983.
