Dear Mr. Coleman:

Enclosed is a petition for reimbursement dated May 13, 2008 received by the Environmental Appeals Board (the "Board") on May 14, 2008, filed by Harless R. Benthul, Attorney, on behalf of Higman Barge Lines, Inc., pursuant to CERCLA Section 106(b). The petition seeks reimbursement of costs incurred by the petitioner.

The Board has issued a revised guidance document, dated November 10, 2004, describing the Board's procedures for addressing Section 106(b) reimbursement petitions. A copy of the Board's guidance is enclosed.

Accordingly, please have your staff prepare and submit a response to the petition, as described more fully in Section IV. A of the Board's guidance. If your response challenges the petitioner's eligibility to seek reimbursement, without regard to the merits of the reimbursement claim, the response should be filed not later than June 17, 2008. If, however, your response does address the merits of the reimbursement claim, the response should be filed not later than July 18, 2008. In either event, please file an original (signed in blue ink) and two copies of the response with the Board at the address shown below, and send a copy of the response to the petitioner's attorney.<sup>1</sup>

Please include with the response a certified index to the administrative record that was compiled in connection with the issuance of the underlying CERCLA Section 106(a) Order. Please also include copies of any documents that are relied on in the response and that have not

The Environmental Appeals Board has an innovative system that allows parties to submit copies of documents, including exhibits, electronically in PDF. Instructions on registration and document submission are available by using the "Electronic Submission" link on the Board's website. Please note that, at the present time, electronic submissions will not be considered a substitute for filing an original document with the Clerk of the Board. The Clerk of the board still must actually receive the original document by the document's due date in order for it to be timely filed. However, Agency offices and private parties that use this system for submitting electronic copies will be excused from the requirement to submit multiple paper copies with their original filing.
