JOINT STATUS REPORT

Petitioner Veolia ES Technical Solutions, L.L.C. ("Petitioner") and Region 5 of the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("Region 5") (collectively, the "Parties"), by and through their undersigned attorneys, respectfully provide the Environmental Appeals Board ("Board"), with this Joint Status Report, as required by the Board's May 25, 2017, Order Granting Second Joint Motion for Extension of Stay. The Parties state the following:

Progress Made by the Parties: Since filing the July 31, 2017, Joint Status Report, the
Parties have held multiple teleconferences to negotiate the terms of a Settlement
Agreement as well as proposed revisions to the final Title V permit for Petitioner's
Sauget, Illinois facility, issued by Region 5 on January 18, 2017 ("Permit"). The Parties
have held telephonic negotiating sessions on August 23rd, August 29th, September 6th,
September 14th, September 19th, and September 21st and have exchanged numerous
drafts of a revised Permit and Settlement Agreement. The Parties expect to attach a draft
revised Permit to a final Settlement Agreement executed by the Parties. At this time, the

Parties believe we are very close to finalizing the Settlement Agreement which will include a draft CAA Title V renewal permit and anticipate reaching agreement shortly.

- 2. <u>Plan and timeline for resolving any outstanding issues</u>. The Parties expect to follow the following timeline (revised since the Parties' July 31, 2017 Joint Status Report):
 - Early October: Region 5 and Petitioner finalize and sign a Settlement Agreement (including an attached draft CAA Title V renewal permit).
 - b. Mid-October: EPA files contingent Settlement Agreement with the Board settlement is contingent on a 30-day notice & comment provisions of 42 U.S.C. § 7413(g).
 - c. Late-October: EPA issues the Settlement Agreement for a 30-day public notice & comment.
 - d. Late November: After an opportunity for notice and comment, the Administrator or his/her designee will consider any written comments in determining whether to withdraw or withhold consent to the Settlement Agreement, in accordance with 42 U.S.C. § 7413(g). If the Administrator or his/her designee elects not to withdraw or withhold consent to the Settlement Agreement, Region 5 will then request voluntary remand of the Permit from the Board and Petitioner will ask for the Petition to be dismissed.
 - e. December: Region 5 issues a proposed CAA Title V renewal permit, followed by public notice and comment, and the issuance of a final renewal CAA Title V permit.
- 3. <u>Completion of the settlement process by November 22, 2017</u>. At this time, the Parties continue to believe that the settlement process can be completed before the Stay expires

on November 22, 2017. The Parties will inform the Board if facts and circumstances

arise that indicate an additional extension of the Stay will be necessary.
