This is to advise you that the Environmental Appeals Board ("Board") received on February 9, 2009, a petition filed by James K. Honke, Hans J. Krock, James S. Kumagai, and Victor D. Moreland, asking the Board to review two permit determinations issued by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, Region 9, in the above-captioned case.¹

To assist the Environmental Appeals Board in deciding whether the matters raised by petitioners should be reviewed, please have your staff prepare a response that addresses the petitioners' contentions and whether petitioners have satisfied the requirements for obtaining review under 40 C.F.R. §124.19(a). Please file an original (signed in blue ink) and two copies of these materials no later than August 17, 2009, and send a copy of the response to petitioners with a certificate of service showing the date and method of service.²

¹ This petition was inadvertently attached to another document in the course of intake processing at the Board. On July 21, 2009, Mr. Moreland telephoned the Board to ask about the status of his petition. Upon investigation, the Board discovered that the petition had been misfiled, and that it had indeed been formally filed on February 9, 2009.

² The Environmental Appeals Board has an innovative system that allows parties to submit copies of documents, including exhibits, electronically in PDF. Instructions on registration and document submission, are available by using the "Electronic Submission" link on the Board's website. Please note that, at the present time, electronic submissions will not be considered a substitute for filing an original document with the Clerk of the Board. The Clerk of the Board still must actually received the original document by the document's due date in order

All documents, including the materials due August 17, 2009, must reference the appeal number. **IMPORTANT**: In addition, any envelope or other packaging containing documents sent to the Board's mailing address or hand-delivery address, as prescribed below, must bear a complete and accurate return address in the upper left-hand corner. The envelope or packaging must also clearly state the case name and appeal number in the lower left hand corner.

Parties are encouraged to utilize the Board's e-filing system or non-U.S. Postal Service carriers and the Board's hand-delivery address when filing pleadings with the Board.
