Further to our recent discussions, I'm pleased to outline below the approach which Magnolia Network will be taking in collaboration with Chase Morrill/Kennebec Cabins and Dorsey Pictures with respect to the inclusion of pre-1978 cabins in season 11 of Maine Cabin Masters (the "Series") and the highlighting of compliance with lead paint laws.

While casting is still ongoing, we anticipate that no less than three (3) episodes of the Series will feature pre-1978 cabins and as such these episodes will include dialogue demonstrating the need for testing/compliance with some aspect of the federal Renovation, Repair and Painting Rule.

All lines in the show about testing for lead paint and/or compliance will be presented in an organic manner to the creative; further, if more than 3 episodes feature pre-1978 cabins, the network will make good faith efforts to include similar creative where feasible. Where appropriate and consistent with show creative, the show will also endeavor to show workers in Tyvek gear. Finally, for those episodes in which lead paint is discussed or discovered, a credit substantially in the form "For more information about lead paint laws go to www.epa.gov/lead" will be included in the episode.
