CONSENT AGREEMENT AND FINAL ORDER

Complainant, the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA"), having issued the Complaint referenced herein on December 6, 2016, against Del Valle Group (hereinafter referred as "Respondent"), and

Complainant and Respondent having agreed that settlement of this matter is in the public interest, and that entry of this Consent Agreement and Final Order ("CA/FO") without further litigation is the most appropriate means of resolving this matter;

NOW, THEREFORE, before the taking of any testimony, upon the pleadings, without adjudication of any issue of fact or law, and upon consent and agreement of the Parties, it is hereby agreed, and ordered as follows:

I. PRELIMINARY STATEMENT

1. EPA initiated this proceeding for the assessment of a civil penalty pursuant to Section 309 of the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1319.
2. In the Complaint, EPA alleges that Respondent violated Sections 301(a) and 402(p) of the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. §§ 1311(a) and 1342(p), for: (1) its failure to apply for and obtain National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System ("NPDES") permit coverage for its stormwater discharges associated with construction activities from the San Germán Surf and Water Fun Park Construction Project ("Project") located in San Germán, Puerto Rico; (2) its

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discharges of pollutants from the Project into waters of the United States without NPDES permit coverage; and (3) its failure to comply with Part 7 of EPA's 2012 NPDES General Permit for Discharges from Construction Activities at the Project.

3. EPA notified the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico regarding this action and offered an opportunity for the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico to confer with EPA on the proposed penalty assessment, pursuant to 40 C.F.R. Part 22.
4. This action was public noticed. No public comment was received.
5. No answer to the Complaint was filed. Upon receipt of the Complaint, Respondent expressed its intention to settle quickly; therefore, Complainant agreed for an extension of time to answer the Complaint by Respondent, which was granted by the Regional Judicial Officer.
6. This CA/FO shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent, its officers, directors, employees, successors and assigns, including, but not limited to, subsequent purchasers.
7. Respondent stipulates that EPA has jurisdiction over the subject matter alleged in the Complaint and that the Complaint states a claim upon which relief can be granted against Respondent.
8. Respondent waives any defenses it might have as to jurisdiction and venue, and, without admitting or denying the factual or legal allegations contained in the Complaint, consents to the terms of this CA/FO.
9. Respondent hereby waives its right to a judicial or administrative hearing or appeal on any issue of law or fact set forth in the Complaint.

II. TERMS OF SETTLEMENT

10. Pursuant to Section 309(g) of the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g), the nature of the violations and other relevant factors, EPA and Respondent have agreed to settle this action for the amount of **FORTY-TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$42,000.00)**.
11. For purposes of settlement, Respondent consents to the issuance of this Consent Agreement and consents to the payment of the civil penalty cited in the foregoing Paragraph.

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III. Penalty

12. Respondent shall pay the amount of **FORTY-TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$42,000.00)**.
13. No later than thirty (30) calendar days from the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall make an initial payment of fourteen thousand dollars (\$14,000.00).
14. Thereafter, Respondent shall make two (2) additional payments of fourteen thousand dollars (\$14,000.00) each, plus the applicable interest, in accordance with the following schedule:
 - a. the first \$14,046.67 of the two additional payments no later than ninety (90) calendar days from the effective date of this Order; and
 - b. the last and final payment of \$14,035.00 no later than one-hundred and eighty (180) calendar days from the effective date of this Order.
15. The effective date of this Consent Agreement shall be the date the Regional Judicial Officer signs the Final Order accompanying this Consent Agreement.
16. Respondent shall pay the amount cited in paragraph 12, either by check payable to the "*Treasurer of the United States of America*", electronically (i.e. wire or automated clearinghouse) or on line payment
17. Respondent shall clearly identify, regardless of the form of payment, the name and docket number of the case, set forth in the caption on the first page of this document. Payment methods are described below:

19. Failure to pay the amount indicated in Paragraph 12, above, in full according to the provisions of this agreement will result in a referral of this matter to the United States Department of Justice or the United States Department of the Treasury for collection.
20. Further, if the payment is not received on or before the due date, interest will be assessed at the annual rate established by the Secretary of Treasury pursuant to the Debt Collection Act, 31 U.S.C. § 3717, on the overdue amount from the due date through the date of payment. In addition, a late payment handling charge of \$15.00 will be assessed for each 30-day period (or any portion thereof) following the due date in which the balance remains unpaid. A 6% per annum penalty also will be applied on any principal amount not paid within 90 days of the due date.
21. In addition, pursuant to Section 309(g)(9) of the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g)(9), if payment is not received by the due date, a quarterly nonpayment penalty will be imposed for each calendar quarter during which such nonpayment persists. The quarterly nonpayment penalty is 20% of the aggregate amount of penalties and quarterly nonpayment penalties which are unpaid as of the beginning of such quarter.
22. Respondent also may be required to pay attorney's fees and costs for collection proceedings in connection with nonpayment.
23. The penalty to be paid is a civil penalty assessed by the EPA and shall not be deductible from the Respondent's federal or Commonwealth of Puerto Rico taxes.

IV. General Provisions

24. The Respondent waives any right it may have pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 22.8 to be present during discussions with or to be served with and to reply to any memorandum or communication addressed to the Director or the Regional Administrator where the purpose of such discussion, memorandum, or communication is to discuss a proposed settlement of this matter or to recommend that such official accept this Consent Agreement and issue the accompanying Final Order.
25. Nothing in this agreement shall be construed as prohibiting, altering or in any way limiting the ability of EPA to seek any other remedies or sanctions available by virtue of Respondent's violation of this agreement or of the statutes and regulations upon which this agreement is based, or for Respondent's violation of any applicable provision of law.
26. This CA/FO shall not relieve Respondent of its obligation to comply with all applicable provisions of federal, state or local law, nor shall it be construed to be a ruling on, or determination of, any issue related to any federal, state or local permit.
27. This CA/FO constitutes a settlement by EPA of all claims for civil penalties pursuant to the Clean Water Act for the violations alleged in the Complaint. Nothing in this CA/FO is intended to, nor shall be construed to, operate in any way to resolve any criminal liability of the Respondent. Compliance with this CA/FO shall not be a defense to any actions subsequently commenced pursuant to Federal laws and regulations administered by EPA, and it is the responsibility of Respondent to comply with such laws and regulations.
28. Each undersigned representative of the parties to this Consent Agreement certifies that he or she is fully authorized by the party represented to enter into the terms and conditions of this Consent Agreement and to execute and legally bind that party to it.
29. Each party shall bear its own costs and attorneys' fees in connection with the action resolved by this CA/FO.


