CONSENT AGREEMENT AND FINAL ORDER

I. Nature of the Action

- This is a civil penalty proceeding pursuant to Section 14(a) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, 7 U.S.C. § 136l(a) (hereinafter "FIFRA"), and pursuant to the Consolidated Rules of Practice Governing Administrative Assessment of Civil Penalties and the Revocation/Termination or Suspension of Permits (Consolidated Rules), 40 CFR Part 22. Complainant is the Director of the Air, Pesticides, and Toxics Management Division, United States Environmental Protection Agency, Region 4 (EPA). Respondent is Syngenta Crop Protection, Inc.
- 2. Complainant and Respondent have conferred for the purpose of settlement pursuant to 40 CFR § 22.18 and desire to resolve this matter and settle the allegations described herein without a formal hearing. Therefore, without the taking of any evidence or testimony, the making of any argument, or the adjudication of any issue in this matter, and in accordance with 40 CFR § 22.13(b), this Consent Agreement and Final Order (CAFO) will simultaneously commence and conclude this matter.

II. Preliminary Statements

- 3. The authority to take action under Section 14(a) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136*l*(a), is vested in the Administrator of EPA. The Administrator of EPA has delegated this authority under FIFRA by EPA Delegation 5-14, dated May 11, 1994.
- 4. Pursuant to 40 CFR § 22.5(c)(4) the following individual represents EPA in this matter and is authorized to receive service for EPA in this proceeding:

- Respondent is Syngenta Crop Protection, Inc., incorporated in the State of Delaware, and doing business in North Carolina. Respondent is located at 410 S. Swing Road, Greensboro, NC 27409.
- 6. Respondent is a "person" as defined by Section 2(s) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136(s), in that it is a corporation, and as such is subject to FIFRA and the regulations promulgated thereunder.
- 7. Respondent is a "registrant" as defined by Section 2(y) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136(y) in that it is a person who has registered pesticides pursuant to the provisions of FIFRA.
- 8. Respondent is a "producer" as defined by Section 2(w) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136(w), in that it is a person who manufacturers, prepares, compounds, propagates, or processes any pesticide.
- 9. "Pesticide" is defined by Section 2(u) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136(u), to mean any substance or mixture of substances intended for preventing, destroying, repelling, or mitigating any pest.

- 10. "Restricted Use Pesticide" means a pesticide the Administrator (or designee) has determined that, when applied in accordance with its directions for use, warnings and cautions and for the uses for which it is registered, or for one or more of such uses, or in accordance with a widespread and commonly recognized practice, may generally cause, without additional regulatory restrictions, unreasonable adverse effects on the environment, including injury to the applicator, as set forth in Section 3(d)(1)(C) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136a(d)(1)(C).
- 11. Respondent produces pesticides, including restricted use pesticides, "to distribute or sell" as that term is defined by Section 2(gg) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. §136(gg), in that the pesticides are held for distribution, held for sale, held for shipment, shipped, delivered for shipment, released for shipment or received and (having so received) delivered or offered to deliver.
- Respondent produces the restricted use pesticide "Lumax Selective Herbicide, EPA Registration No. 100-1152.
- 13. On or about September 22, 2006, Complainant sent Respondent a letter to its office located at 410 S. Swing Road, Greensboro, NC 27409, requesting information regarding the airing of television advertisements for Lumax Selective Herbicide which did not include the classification of the pesticide as a restricted use pesticide.
- 14. Respondent provided information that on or about February 27, 2006, through March 26, 2006, television advertisements which failed to include the classification of the Lumax Selective Herbicide as a restricted use pesticide were aired a total of 365 times in the states of Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, and Wisconsin.

- 15. Under Section 12(a)(2)(E) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(2)(E), it is unlawful for a registrant, wholesaler, dealer, retailer, or other distributor to advertise a product registered under FIFRA for restricted use without giving the classification of the product assigned to it under Section 3 of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136a.
- 16. Respondent violated Section 12(a)(2)(E) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(2)(E), on at least
 365 separate occasions and is therefore subject to the assessment of civil penalties under
 Section 14 of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136l.
- On or about July 12, 2006, an inspector with the Alabama Department of Agriculture and an authorized representative of the EPA conducted an inspection at the Syngenta Crop Protection, Inc., facility located at 13500 U.S. Highway 43 North, Bucks, AL 36512.
- 18. During the aforementioned inspection, the product Mesotrione Wet Paste, EPA
 Registration No. 100-1150, was identified as being produced and distributed by the
 Respondent.
- The inspector documented five shipments of Mesotrione Wet Paste from the Respondent to Syngenta Crop Protection facilities located in St. Gabriel, Louisiana (Bill-of-Lading No. 4229075, shipped February 8, 2006); Omaha, Nebraska (Bill-of-Lading No. 4227492, shipped January 24, 2006; Bill-of-Lading No. 4228008, shipped February 1, 2006; and Bill-of-Lading No. 4227501, shipped January 20, 2006); and Brazil (Bill of Lading No. 2915475, shipped May 26, 2006).
- 20. At the time of the inspection, the inspector collected samples of Mesotrione Wet Paste.
- 21. Analysis of the samples of Mesotrione Wet Paste confirmed the presence of a chemical impurity of toxicological significance which was not included in the statement submitted in connection with the product's registration.

- 22. Under Section 12(a)(1)(C) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(1)(C), it is unlawful for any person in any State to distribute or sell to any person any registered pesticide the composition of which differs at the time of its distribution or sale from its composition as described in the statement required in connection with its registration under Section 3 of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136a.
- 23. Respondent violated Section 12(a)(1)(C) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(1)(C), on at least five separate occasions and is therefore subject to the assessment of civil penalties under Section 14 of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136*l*.
- After consideration of the factors set forth in Section 14(a)(4) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C.
 § 136l(a)(4), EPA proposes to assess total civil penalty of ONE HUNDRED NINTY-SIX
 THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$196,300). Civil penalties under Section
 14(a) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136l(a), may be assessed by Administrative Order.

III. Consent Agreement

- 25. For the purposes of this CAFO, Respondent admits the jurisdictional allegations set forth above and neither admits nor denies the factual allegations.
- 26. Respondent waives its right to a hearing on the allegations contained herein and its right to appeal the proposed final order accompanying the consent agreement.
- 27. Respondent consents to the assessment of the penalty proposed by EPA and agrees to pay the civil penalty as set forth in this CAFO.
- 28. Respondent certifies that as of the date of its execution of this CAFO, it is in compliance with all relevant requirements of FIFRA.
- 29. Compliance with this CAFO shall resolve the allegations of the violations contained herein. This CAFO shall not otherwise affect any liability of Respondent to the United

States. Other than as expressed herein, neither EPA nor Complainant waives any right to bring an enforcement action against Respondent for violation of any federal or state statute, regulation or permit, to initiate an action for imminent and substantial endangerment, or to pursue criminal enforcement.

30. Complainant and Respondent agree to settle this matter by their execution of this CAFO. The parties agree that the settlement of this matter is in the public interest and that this CAFO is consistent with the applicable requirements of FIFRA.

IV. Final Order

- 31. Respondent is assessed a civil penalty of ONE HUNDRED NINTY-SIX THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$196,300), which shall be paid within 30 days from the effective date of this CAFO.
- 32. Respondent shall remit the penalty by either a cashier's or certified check made payable to the "Treasurer, United States of America," and shall send the check via U.S. mail to the following address:

The check shall reference the name and the Docket Number of the CAFO

33. At the time of payment, Respondent shall send a separate copy of the check and a written statement that the payment is being made in accordance with this CAFO, to the following persons at the following addresses:

Cheryn L. Jones Pesticides Management Section U.S. EPA - Region 4 61 Forsyth Street Atlanta, Georgia 30303-8960;

Saundi Wilson Office of Environmental Accountability U.S. EPA - Region 4 61 Forsyth Street Atlanta, Georgia 30303-8960.

- 34. For the purposes of state and federal income taxation, Respondent shall not be entitled, and agrees not to attempt, to claim a deduction for any civil penalty payment made pursuant to this CAFO. Any attempt by Respondent to deduct any such payments shall constitute a violation of this CAFO.
- 35. Pursuant to 31 U.S.C. § 3717, EPA is entitled to assess interest and penalties on debts owed to the United States and a charge to cover the cost of processing and handling a delinquent claim. Interest will therefore begin to accrue on the civil penalty from the date of entry of this CAFO, if the penalty is not paid by the date required. A charge will also be assessed to cover the administrative costs, both direct and indirect, of overdue debts. In addition, a late payment penalty charge shall be applied on any principal amount not paid within 90 days of the due date.
- 36. Complainant and Respondent shall bear their own costs and attorney fees in this matter.
- 37. This CAFO shall be binding upon the Respondent, its successors and assigns.

38. The undersigned representative of the party to this CAFO certifies that he or she is fully authorized by the party represented to enter into this CAFO and legally binds that party to this CAFO.

V. Effective Date

39. The effective date of this CAFO shall be the date on which the CAFO is filed with the Regional Hearing Clerk.
