CONSENT AGREEMENT

I.

Preliminary Statement

This administrative Consent Agreement (the “Consent Agreement”) is entered into by and between the Complainant, the Director of the Air Protection Division, United States Environmental Protection Agency, Region III (“EPA” or “Complainant”), and the Respondent, Dassault Falcon Jet – Wilmington Corporation (“Dassault” or the “Respondent”), pursuant to Section 113(a) and (d) of the Clean Air Act (“CAA” or “the Act”), 42 U.S.C. § 7413(a) and (d), and the Consolidated Rules of Practice Governing the Administrative Assessment of Civil Penalties and the Revocation or Suspension of Permits, 40 C.F.R. Part 22 (the “Consolidated Rules of Practice”). The Consolidated Rules of Practice at 40 C.F.R. § 22.13 provide, in pertinent part, that where the parties agree to settlement of one or more causes of action before the filing of a complaint, a proceeding may be commenced and concluded simultaneously by the issuance of a consent agreement and final order pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 22.18(b)(2) and (3).

This Consent Agreement and the accompanying Final Order (collectively referred to as the “CAFO”) addresses violations set forth herein, which occurred at a facility owned and operated by the Respondent at 191 North DuPont Highway New Castle, Delaware.

II. General Provisions

- 1) Section 113(a) and (d) of the Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7413(a) and (d), authorizes the Administrator of EPA to issue an administrative order assessing a civil administrative penalty whenever, on the basis of any information available to the Administrator, the Administrator finds that any person has violated, or is in violation of, any requirement, rule, plan, order, waiver, or permit promulgated, issued, or approved under Subchapters I, IV, V and VI [also referred to as Titles I, IV, V and VI] of the Act. The authority to issue the accompanying Final Order has been duly delegated to the Regional Judicial Officer, EPA Region III.
- 2) For purposes of this proceeding only, Respondent admits the jurisdictional allegations set forth in this Consent Agreement and Final Order and agrees not to contest EPA's jurisdiction with respect to the issuance, execution and enforcement of this Consent Agreement and the accompanying Final Order.
- 3) Except as provided in paragraph 2 above, Respondent neither admits nor denies the specific findings of fact and the conclusions of law set forth in this Consent Agreement and the accompanying Final Order.
- 4) Respondent consents to the issuance of this Consent Agreement and the accompanying Final Order, agrees to comply with the terms and conditions set forth therein, and consents to the payment of a civil penalty as set forth in this CAFO.
- 5) Respondent agrees to pay its own costs and attorney fees.
- 6) Respondent agrees that this Consent Agreement and the accompanying Final Order shall apply to, and be binding upon, Respondent, its officers, directors, servants, employees, agents, successors and assigns.

III. Findings Of Fact And Conclusions Of Law

- 7) In accordance with 40 C.F.R. §§ 22.13(b) and 22.18(b)(2) and (3), EPA alleges the following findings of fact and conclusions of law:
- 8) Respondent is a corporation doing business in the State of Delaware. Respondent operates a business at 191 North DuPont Highway New Castle, Delaware ("the Facility").
- 9) Respondent refurbishes and provides maintenance for aircraft.
- 10) Respondent is a "person" as that term is defined in Section 302(e) of the Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7602(e), and within the meaning of Section 113(d) of the Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7413(d).
- 11) On May 31, 2011, Respondent was issued Title V Operating Permit No. AQM – 003/00365 –

Renewal (R3) (the "Permit") for the Facility, by the State of Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control ("DNREC"), under the applicable State Implementation Plan ("DE SIP") under the CAA.

- 12) On March 19, 2013, EPA conducted a compliance inspection and on-site records review at the Facility.
- 13) On March 27, 2013 and on May 9, 2013, EPA issued Section 114 Information Requests to Dassault. After EPA reviewed Dassault's responses, EPA determined that the Facility was subject to the provisions of 40 Code of Federal Regulations Part 63, subpart HHHHHH (the "Paint Stripping and Miscellaneous Surface Coating NESHAP" or "PSMSC NESHAP").
- 14) Pursuant to 40 CFR § 63.11171, Dassault is an existing affected source for purposes of the PSMSC NESHAP.
- 15) 40 CFR § 63.11175(a) provides that the initial notification deadline for an existing affected source under the PSMSC NESHAP is January 10, 2010.
- 16) On May 31, 2013, EPA received Dassault's Initial Notification under the PSMSC NESHAP.
- 17) Dassault submitted their initial notification more than three years after the initial notification deadline.
- 18) Based on the March 19, 2013 compliance inspection and the Section 114 information requests and responses, EPA has determined that Respondent has failed to comply with the initial notification requirements of 40 CFR Part 63, subpart HHHHHH.

IV. Settlement Recitation, Settlement Conditions, and Civil Penalty

- 19) Respondent herein certifies to Complainant EPA that upon investigation, to the best of its knowledge and belief, all violations alleged in this Consent Agreement have been remedied.
- 20) Complainant and Respondent enter into this Consent Agreement and the accompanying Final Order in order to settle fully and resolve all violations set forth in Section III of this Consent Agreement.
- 21) In full and final settlement of the alleged violations enumerated above in Section III of this Consent Agreement, Respondent consents to the assessment and agrees to pay a civil penalty in the amount of Fourteen Thousand Dollars (\$14,000.00) within the time and manner specified herein.

- 22) The settlement amount of Fourteen Thousand Dollars (\$14,000.00) is based upon Complainant's consideration of and application of the statutory penalty factors set forth in Section 113(e), of the Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7413(e), (which include the size of the business, economic impact of the penalty, the violator's full compliance history and good faith efforts to comply, the duration of the violation as established by any credible evidence, the economic benefit of noncompliance, the payment of penalties previously assessed for same violation, the seriousness of violation and such other matters as justice may require), and EPA's Clean Air Act Stationary Source Civil Penalty Policy (dated October 25, 1991), as indexed for inflation in keeping with 40 C.F.R. Part 19 (Adjustment to Civil Monetary Penalties for Inflation). Complainant has determined that Respondent's payment of this civil penalty shall constitute full and final satisfaction of the violations set forth in Section III of this Consent Agreement.
- 23) Respondent shall pay the civil penalty of Fourteen Thousand Dollars (\$14,000.00) no later than sixty (60) days after the effective date of this Consent Agreement and accompanying Final Order in order to avoid the assessment of interest, administrative costs, and late payment penalties in connection with such civil penalty as described in this Consent Agreement and accompanying Final Order.
- 24) Pursuant to 31 U.S.C. § 3717 and 40 C.F.R. §13.11, EPA is entitled to assess interest and late payment penalties on outstanding debts owed to the United States and a charge to cover the costs of processing and handling a delinquent claim, as more fully described below. Accordingly, Respondent's failure to make timely payment or to comply with the conditions in this Consent Agreement and Final Order shall result in the assessment of late payment charges including interest, penalties, and/or administrative costs of handling delinquent debts.
- 25) Interest on the civil penalty assessed in this Consent Agreement and Final Order will begin to accrue on the date that a copy of this executed Consent Agreement and Final Order is mailed or hand-delivered to Respondent. However, EPA will not seek to recover interest on any amount of the civil penalty that is paid within sixty (60) calendar days after the date on which such interest begins to accrue. Interest will be assessed at the rate of the United States Treasury tax and loan rate in accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 13.11(a).
- 26) The cost of EPA's administrative handling of overdue debts will be charged and assessed monthly throughout the period the debt is overdue. 40 C.F.R. §13.11(b). Pursuant to Appendix 2 of EPA's Resources Management Directives - Cash Management, Chapter 9, EPA will assess a \$15.00 administrative handling charge for administrative costs on unpaid penalties for the first thirty (30) day period after the payment is due and an additional \$15.00 for each subsequent thirty (30) day period in which the penalty remains unpaid.
- 27) A penalty charge of six percent per year will be assessed monthly on any portion of the civil

penalty which remains delinquent for more than ninety (90) calendar days. 40 C.F.R. § 13.11(c). Should assessment of the penalty charge on the debt be required, it shall accrue from the first day payment is delinquent. 31 C.F.R. § 901.9(d).

- 28) Thus, in accordance with the above provisions, to avoid the assessment of interest, late payment penalties, and handling charges on the penalty set forth herein, Respondent must pay the full amount of the civil penalty, in the manner directed, within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this Consent Agreement and accompanying Final Order.
- 29) Payment of the penalty in Paragraph 21 shall be made by cashier's check, certified check, or electronic wire transfer, Automated Clearing House ("ACH"), or an on line, internet payment as specified below. All payments are payable to Treasurer, United States of America and shall reference the above case caption and docket number (CAA-03-2014-0037).

- 30) All payments made by check also shall reference the above case caption and docket number, CAA-03-2014-0037. At the same time that any payment is made, copies of any corresponding check or written notification confirming any electronic transfer through wire transfer, ACH, or internet payment shall be mailed to Lydia A. Guy, Regional Hearing Clerk (3RC00), U.S. EPA, Region III, 1650 Arch Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania 19103-2029, to Daniel E. Boehmcke, Senior Assistant Regional Counsel (3RC10), U.S. EPA Region III, 1650 Arch Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, 19103-2029, and to Paul Arnold (3AP20), U.S. EPA Region III, 1650 Arch Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, 19103-2029.

- 31) Respondent agrees not to deduct for federal tax purposes the civil penalty specified in, and any civil penalty amount paid pursuant to, this Consent Agreement and accompanying Final Order.
- 32) Payment of the penalty specified in Paragraph 21 in the manner set forth in this Consent Agreement and payment of any applicable interest, handling costs and/or late payment charges as set forth above shall constitute full and final satisfaction of all civil claims for penalties for the specific violation alleged in Section III of this Consent Agreement. Compliance with this Consent Agreement and accompanying Final Order shall not be a defense to any action commenced at any time for any other violation of any federal laws and regulations administered by EPA.
- 33) Respondent's failure to make timely payment of the civil penalty or any portion of the civil penalty provided herein may result in referral of this matter to the United States Attorney for enforcement of this Consent Agreement and the accompanying Final Order in the appropriate United States District Court. Additionally, Respondent's failure to make timely payment of the civil penalty or any portion of the civil penalty provided herein may result in the assessment of additional interest, penalties and/or late payment penalty charges.

V. Reservation of Rights

- 34) This Consent Agreement and the accompanying Final Order resolve only the civil claims for the specific violations alleged in Section III of this Consent Agreement. EPA reserves the right to commence action against any person, including Respondent, in response to any condition which EPA determines may present an imminent and substantial endangerment to the public health, public welfare, or the environment. Nor shall anything in this Consent Agreement and Final Order be construed to limit the United States' authority to pursue criminal sanctions. In addition, this settlement is subject to all limitations on the scope of resolution and to the reservation of rights set forth in 40 C.F.R. § 22.18(c). Further, Complainant reserves any rights and remedies available to it under the Act, the regulations promulgated thereunder, and any other federal laws or regulations for which Complainant has jurisdiction, to enforce the provisions of this Consent Agreement and accompanying Final Order following its filing with the Regional Hearing Clerk.

VI. Effective Date

- 35) The effective date of this Consent Agreement and the accompanying Final Order is the date on which the Consent Agreement and Final Order is filed with the Regional Hearing Clerk of EPA Region III.

VII. Waiver of Hearing

36) For the purposes of this proceeding only, Respondent hereby expressly waives its right to a hearing pursuant to Section 113(d)(2)(A) of the Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7413(d)(2)(A), with respect to any issue of law or fact set forth in this CAFO. Respondent also waives its right to appeal the accompanying Final Order.

VIII. Entire Agreement


37) This Consent Agreement and the accompanying Final Order constitute the entire agreement and understanding of the parties concerning settlement of the above-captioned action and there are no representations, warranties, covenants, terms or conditions agreed upon between the parties other than those expressed in this Consent Agreement and the accompanying Final Order. Nothing in this Consent Agreement or the accompanying Final Order shall be construed to affect or limit in any way the obligation of Respondent to comply with all federal, state and local laws and regulations governing any activity required by this Consent Agreement and the accompanying Final Order.

IX. Execution

38) The person signing this Consent Agreement on behalf of Respondent acknowledges and certifies by his/her signature that he/she is fully authorized to enter into this Consent Agreement and to legally bind Respondent, to the terms and conditions of this Consent Agreement and the accompanying Final Order.






FINAL ORDER

In accordance with 40 C.F.R. §§ 22.13(b), and 22.18(b)(2) and (3) of the Consolidated Rules of Practice, the attached Consent Agreement and Final Order (“CAFO”) simultaneously commences and resolves claims against Dassault Falcon Jet – Wilmington Corporation (“Dassault” or the “Respondent”). The basis of the CAFO is Respondent’s failure to comply with the CAA, and provisions of the National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (“NESHAPs”) at Respondent’s jet manufacturing plant where painting and surface-coating operations are carried out, located at 191 North DuPont Highway, New Castle, Delaware (the “Facility”).

The specific provision alleged to have been violated is the initial notification requirement of 40 CFR Part 63, subpart HHHHHH (the “Paint Stripping and Miscellaneous Surface Coating NESHAP” or “PSMSC NESHAP”).

For purposes of achieving full settlement of the violations alleged in Section III, EPA has determined that a civil penalty of fourteen thousand dollars (\$14,000) is appropriate. As explained in Section IV of the CAFO, this penalty is based upon EPA’s consideration of a number of factors, including but not limited to the statutory factors set forth in Section 113(e) of the CAA, 42 U.S.C. § 7413(e), which include: the seriousness of the violations, the duration of the violations, and Respondent’s compliance history and good faith efforts to comply. These factors were applied to the particular facts and circumstances of this case with specific reference to EPA’s Clean Air Act Stationary Source Civil Penalty Policy, and adjusted for inflation pursuant to 40 C.F.R. Part 19.

Based on the foregoing, we recommend that you sign the attached Final Order and return it to the Daniel Boehmcke of the Office of Regional Counsel for further processing.
