Dear President Stiffarm and Ms. Has The Eagle:

This is an Addendum to the Administrative Order (Order) issued to The Gros Ventre and Assiniboine Tribes of the Fort Belknap Indian Community (FBIC) and Prarie Mountain Utilities (PMU) on January 29, 2021. The purpose of this letter is to approve the FBIC and PMU's June 29, 2023, schedule (Schedule) for coming into consistent compliance with the Disinfection Byproducts Rule (DBPR) violations. The Schedule is hereby incorporated into the Order on Consent pursuant to paragraph 22. Each milestone and deadline specified below is an enforceable provision of the Order.

Milestone	<u>Deadline</u>	Projected Cost
Resolve the 3-phase power imbalance by	September 30, 2023	
constructing a true 3-phase power connection at		
the tank site, requiring approximately 12,600		
linear feet of new 3-phase overhead conductor		
by NorthWest Energy.		
Install two new motors, a pump, and telemetry	October 30, 2023	\$133,961
for the aeration system at the storage tank.		
Ensure sensor can be read from the treatment		
plant.		

Within 10 calendar days of completing all steps included in the above Schedule, please notify the EPA of the project's completion as required by the Order. The Order also requires FBIC and PMU to achieve and maintain compliance with the DBPR by the final date specified in the approved Schedule. The EPA is authorized to seek penalties if these deadlines are not met. If FBIC and PMU have a reasonable basis to believe they may be unable to meet any deadline in the Schedule, they must notify the EPA well in advance of the Scheduled deadline to request an extension. The EPA may, in its discretion, consider granting an extension.
