I. Preliminary Statement

1. The Findings of Violations are made and the Compliance Order (the Finding of Violations and Compliance Order are collectively referred to herein as the "Order") is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA"), by Section 309(a)(3) of the Clean Water Act ("the Act"), 33 U.S.C. § 1319(a)(3), as delegated by the Administrator to the Director of EPA Region 7's Water, Wetlands and Pesticides Division.
2. The Respondent is the Platte County Regional Sewer District, Brush Creek Facility, Tracy, Missouri ("Respondent").
3. The State of Missouri is not authorized to administer the Sludge Management Program established pursuant to Section 405(d)(1) of the Act. Therefore, EPA directly implements the Sludge Management Program in Missouri and is responsible for enforcement of the requirements of the Sludge Management Program.

II. Statutory and Regulatory Framework

4. Section 405(d)(1) of the Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1345(d)(1), provides that the Administrator shall develop and publish regulations providing guidelines for the disposal of sludge and the utilization of sludge for various purposes.
5. Pursuant to Section 405(d)(1) of the Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1345(d)(1), EPA promulgated regulations governing the Standards for the Use or Disposal of Sewage Sludge which are set forth at 40 C.F.R. Part 503 (the "Sludge Management Program"). These regulations establish recordkeeping and reporting requirements, pollutant limits and site management practices

applicable to owners or operators of treatment works treating domestic sewage, and standards for the final use or disposal of sewage sludge generated during the treatment of domestic sewage in treatment works.

### III. Factual Background

6. Pursuant to 40 C.F.R. Part 503.18(a), Class I sludge management facilities, Publically Owned Treatment Works (POTWs) (as defined in 40 C.F.R. § 501.2) with a design flow rate equal to or greater than one million gallons per day, and POTWs that serve a population of 10,000 or more, shall submit the information outlined in 40 C.F.R. § 503.18(a)(1) and (2) to EPA by February 19th, annually.

7. Respondent is a “municipality” as defined by Section 502(4) of the Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1362(4), and is therefore a “person,” as defined by Section 502(5) of the Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1362(5).

8. Respondent owns and operates the Platte County Regional Sewer District, Brush Creek Facility, located in Tracy, Missouri, which is a “treatment works treating domestic sewage,” as defined by 40 C.F.R. § 122.2.

9. The Platte County Regional Sewer District, Brush Creek Facility, is a POTW with a design flow rate equal to or greater than one million gallons per day.

### IV. Violation

10. The facts stated in paragraphs 6 through 9 are herein incorporated.

11. As a POTW with a design flow rate equal to or greater than one million gallons per day, Respondent was required to submit to EPA the information required under 40 C.F.R. 503 18(a)(1) and (2) for the calendar year 2009 by February 19, 2010.

12. To date, Respondent has failed to submit to EPA the information outlined in 40 C.F.R. § 503.18(a)(1) and (2) for sludge handling and disposal activities in calendar year 2009, in violation of 40 C.F.R. § 503.18(a)(1) and (2), promulgated pursuant to Section 405 of the Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1345(d)(1).

### V. Order for Compliance

Based on the foregoing FINDINGS OF VIOLATION and pursuant to the authority of Section 309(a)(3) of the Act, 33 U.S.C. 1319(a)(3), Respondent is hereby ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

13. No later than fifteen (15) calendar days following the receipt of this Order, Respondent shall submit a complete annual report for sludge handling and disposal activities in calendar year 2009. The report must include all of the information required by 40 C.F.R. § 503.18(a) and shall be submitted to the EPA contact listed in paragraph 14.

#### **VI. General Provisions**


15. The provisions of this Order are severable. If any provision of this Order is determined to be unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.


16. This Order does not constitute a waiver or a modification of any requirements of the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. 1251 *et seq.*, all of which remain in full force and effect. The EPA retains the right to seek any and all remedies available under Sections 309 of the Act, 33 U.S.C. 1319, for any violation cited in this Order. Issuance of this Order shall not be deemed an election by EPA to forgo any civil or criminal action to seek penalties, fines, or other appropriate relief under the Act for any violation whatsoever.

17. This Order shall remain in effect until a written notice of termination is issued by an authorized representative of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Such notice shall not be given until all of the requirements of this Order have been met.

This Order shall become effective upon the date of receipt by Respondent.
