Enclosed is a Proposed Compliance Order. Penalty Complaint. And Notice Of Opportunity For Hearing (complaint) issued by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as authorized by the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA), 42 U.S.C. § 300h-2. The document alleges that RIM Operating, Inc., has violated the SDWA and proposes both compliance requirements and the assessment of a civil penalty. Please note that there are deadlines in the complaint that must be met. The complaint is effective upon the receipt date and the company has thirty (30) calendar days to file an answer to dispute the contents of the complaint.

Also note that under the Rules of Practice, RIM Operating, Inc. may just send in a check for that amount to settle the proceeding, without the need for a settlement agreement, once the required public notice period has occurred. 40 C.F.R. §§ 22.18 and 22.45. A sheet with payment instructions is enclosed.

INTRODUCTION

- 1. This Proposed Compliance Order, Penalty Complaint, and Notice of Opportunity for Hearing (complaint) is authorized by Congress in section 1423 of the Public Health Service Act, commonly known as the Safe Drinking Water Act (the Act). 42 U.S.C. § 300h-2. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations authorized by the statute are set out in part 144 of title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.), and violations of the statute, permits or EPA regulations constitute violations of the Act. The rules for this proceeding are the "Consolidated Rules of Practice Governing the Administrative Assessment of Civil Penaltics, Issuance of Compliance or Corrective Action Orders and the Revocation, Termination or Suspension of Permits ("Rules of Practice")," 40 C.F.R. Part 22, a copy of which is enclosed.
- The undersigned EPA official has been properly delegated the authority to issue this complaint.
- 3. EPA alleges that RIM Operating, Inc., (Respondent) has violated the regulations and therefore the Act, as more fully explained below.

NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR A HEARING

- 4. Respondent has the right to a public hearing before a presiding officer within the Agency to (1) disagree with any fact alleged by EPA in the complaint, (2) state the grounds for any legal defense or (3) disagree with the appropriateness of the proposed penalty.
- 5. To disagree with the complaint and assert Respondent's right to a hearing. Respondent must file a written answer (and one copy) with the Regional Hearing Clerk (1595 Wynkoop Street (8RC); Denver, Colorado 80202) within thirty (30) calendar days of receiving this complaint. The answer must clearly admit, deny or explain the factual allegations of the complaint, the grounds for any defense, the facts Respondent may dispute, and Respondent's specific request for a public hearing. Please see section 22.15 of the Rules of Practice for a complete description of what must be in the answer. FAILURE TO FILE AN

ANSWER AND REQUEST A HEARING WITHIN THIRTY (30) CALENDAR DAYS MAY WAIVE RESPONDENT'S RIGHT TO DISAGREE WITH THE ALLEGATIONS OR PROPOSED PENALTY, AND RESULT IN A DEFAULT JUDGMENT AND ASSESSMENT OF PENALTY UP TO THE MAXIMUM AUTHORIZED BY THE ACT.

SETTLEMENT NEGOTIATIONS

6. EPA encourages discussing whether cases can be settled through informal settlement conferences. If Respondent wants to pursue the possibility of settling this matter, or has any other questions, contact the attorney listed at the end of this complaint. Please note that calling the attorney or requesting a settlement conference does NOT delay the running of the thirty (30) day period for filing an answer and requesting a hearing.

GENERAL ALLEGATIONS

The following general allegations apply to all times relevant to this action and to each violation alleged in this complaint:

- 7. Respondent, RIM Operating, Inc., is a corporation doing business in the State of Utah.
- 8. Respondent is a "person" as defined in the Act, and is therefore subject to the requirements of the statute and regulations. 42 U.S.C. § 300f (12), 40 C.F.R. §§124, 144 and 146.
- 9. Respondent owns and/or operates three enhanced recovery injection wells in section 16, township 9S, range 20E in Uintah County, Utah named "Duck Creek #6-16GR" in the northeast quadrant of the southwest quadrant, "Duck Creek #5-16GR" in the southwest quadrant of the southwest quadrant, and "Natural Duck #8-15R" in the southwest quadrant of the northwest quadrant.
- 10. The three wells defined in paragraph 9 are "Class II Injection Wells" as defined by 40 C.F.R. §§144.80 and 146.5.
 - 11. Respondent is subject to applicable requirements of 40 C.F.R. §§124, 144 and 146.
- 12. The Duck Creek #6-16GR well is authorized to operate by EPA permit UT20888-04587. The Duck Creek #5-16GR well is authorized to operate by EPA permit UT20757-04237. The Natural Duck #8-15R well is authorized to operate by EPA permit UT20879-04585. Respondent is required to comply with all conditions in the permits.
- 13. In 2009, the maximum allowable injection pressure (MAIP) authorized by the permit was 1741 pounds per square inch gauge (psig) for Duck Creek #6-16GR, 1790 psig for Duck Creek #5-16GR, and 1728 psig for Natural Duck #8-15R.

- 14. Respondent injected at the Duck Creek #6-16GR well at a pressure of 1775 psig during April of 2009. Respondent injected at the Duck Creek #5-16GR well at a pressure of 1850 psig during April and June of 2009, 1820 psig during September of 2009, and 1880 psig during December of 2009. Respondent injected at the Natural Duck #8-15R well at a pressure of 1775 during April of 2009, 1750 psig during May of 2009, 1825 psig during June of 2009, 1750 psig during July of 2009, 1740 psig during August and September of 2009, and 1770 psig during November of 2009.
- 15. Respondent violated EPA regulations and therefore the statute by operating a Class II salt water disposal well at pressures greater than the permitted maximum. 42 U.S.C. § 300h-2 (c)(1); 40 C.F.R. §§ 144.51(a) and 144.52(a)(3), and 146.23.

PROPOSED CIVIL PENALTY

- 16. For an administrative proceeding, the Act authorizes the assessment of a civil penalty of up to \$16,000 per day, for each violation of the Act, up to a maximum of \$177,500. 42 U.S.C. § 300h-2 (c)(1). The Act requires EPA to take into account appropriate factors in assessing a civil penalty, including the seriousness of the violations, the economic benefit resulting from the violations, any history of such violations, any good-faith efforts to comply with the requirements, the economic impact on the violator, and such other matters as justice may require. Taking such factors into account, EPA proposes the assessment of a civil penalty of \$7.500 for each well in violation for a total of \$22,500 for the violations alleged in this complaint.
- 17. As required by the Act, prior to the assessment of a civil penalty, EPA will provide public notice of the proposed penalty, and reasonable opportunity for the public to comment on the matter and present evidence in the event a hearing is held 42 U.S.C. § 300h-2 (c)(3)(B).

PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE

The purpose of this notice is to solicit written comments on a Proposed Compliance Order, Penalty Complaint, and Notice of Opportunity for Hearing (complaint) [Docket No. SDWA-08-2010-0079] that Region 8 of the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has issued to RIM Operating, Inc., for alleged violations at three facilities located in Section 16, Township 9S, Range 20E of Uintah County, Utah. The complaint alleges violations of the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) and the regulations detailing the requirements of the SDWA's Underground Injection Control (UIC) program. These regulations govern the injection of fluids that may endanger an underground source of drinking water (USDW). The complaint alleges that the company injected fluids in three wells above the allowed pressure and proposes compliance requirements and a civil penalty of \$22,500 for the alleged violation.

EPA desires to receive written comments from any interested party having knowledge of the alleged violations or who can provide any information useful to ensure that the complaint is appropriate. EPA will review and consider all comments received, and will thereafter determine whether the comments, if any, justify the modification or withdrawal of the complaint.

BACKGROUND

Part C of the SDWA (40 U.S.C. §300h et seq) requires EPA to regulate underground injection of fluid through wells to assure that underground sources of drinking water (USDWs) are not endangered. Section 1421 of the SDWA (40 U.S.C. §300h) requires EPA to administer UIC programs in States or Indian Reservations that do not have approved UIC programs. Regulation of the UIC Class V Program has not been delegated to the Ute Indian Tribe, therefore, EPA administers the program in accordance with title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations (40 C.F.R.) parts 124, 144, 146, 147, and 148.

The three UIC wells, which are the subject of this complaint, are Class II wells pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 146.5, which inject fluid for enhanced recovery of oil or natural gas.

The complaint alleges that RIM Operating, Inc., is in violation of UIC regulations and is subject to appropriate penalties for failing to prevent movement of fluids into a USDW that may cause a violation of a

The complaint alleges that RIM Operating, Inc., is in violation of UIC regulations and is subject to appropriate penalties for failing to prevent movement of fluids into a USDW that may cause a violation of a primary drinking water regulation under 40 C.F.R. Part 142 or otherwise adversely affect the health of persons.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Written comments on the complaint are encouraged and will be accepted at the address listed below for a period of thirty (30) calendar days after the publication of this notice. Written comments submitted by the public, as well as information submitted by RIM Operating, Inc., will be available for public review as part of the Administrative Record, subject to the provisions of law restricting the disclosure of confidential information. RIM Operating, Inc., may request a hearing. Any person submitting written comments will be notified of and has a right to participate in such a hearing. The complaint and the Administrative Record are available for review between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. at the address listed below.
