Motion in Response to Order to Show Cause, Status Report and Request for Extension of Time to File Executed Consent Agreement and Final Order

COMES NOW Complainant, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA" or "Complainant") through the undersigned attorney, and respectfully alleges, prays and requests as follows:

Pursuant to the December 21, 2012 Order issued by the Administrative Law Judge, Honorable M. Lisa Buschmann, Counsel for Complainant submits the following motion in the above captioned matter.

The Complainant and the Molinos de Puerto Rico, Inc. (Respondent) (herein together the "Parties") have been actively participating in good faith negotiations, including conference calls, in order to expedite a final settlement of this matter.

On November 5, 2012, Complainant presented Respondent with a settlement offer.

On December 14, 2012, the Complainant and the Respondent reached an agreement dispositive of all matters asserted in the Administrative Complaint, including a penalty, and as to the final language and terms of the Consent Agreement and Final Order (CA/FO).

The CA/FO has been set into concurrence for approval and signature. The Respondent has signed the CA/FO (see *Attachment A, page 7*). Once the concurrence process finalizes in EPA Region 2's San Juan office, it will be sent to EPA Region 2's New York office for continuance of the review and concurrence process and for signature of the Final Order by the Regional Administrator. Once this process concludes, the fully executed CA/FO will immediately be filed.

Due to an oversight in dealing with these settlement negotiations, the undersigned attorney was delayed in the completion of the prehearing brief.

Respondent's counselors expressed no objection and agreed to the inclusion of Complainant's request in the filing of this motion.

This Motion has been filed today in order to have the Administrative Law Judge, Honorable M. Lisa Buschmann, take notice of the efforts made by the Parties in

reaching a settlement dispositive of all matters asserted in the administrative complaint and in the progress of filling an executed CA/FO.

In light of the above, and that there is no undue delay, bad faith or dilatory motive that can affect Respondent's rights under law, and there is no prejudice or additional burden to Respondent, and due to the complexity of the review and concurrence process within the Agency and between the Parties in order to finalize a fully executed CA/FO, the Complainant requests the Honorable Presiding Officer to allow the Parties until January 28, 2013, in order to file the duly executed CA/FO and notify its execution to the Presiding Officer, or in the alternative, to file Complainant's Initial Prehearing Exchange.

This Motion was discussed today, December 21st, 2012, with José A. Cepeda Rodríguez, Esq., attorney for Respondent, who agreed to the filing of this motion.

CONSENT AGREEMENT AND ORDER

Complainant, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), having issued the Complaint herein on September 6, 2012, against Molinos de Puerto Rico, Inc. (Respondent), and

Complainant and Respondent having agreed that settlement of this matter is in the public interest, and that entry of this Consent Agreement and Final Order (CA/FO) without further litigation is the most appropriate means of resolving this matter;

NOW, THEREFORE, before the taking of any testimony, upon the pleadings, without adjudication of any issue of fact or law, and upon consent and agreement of the Parties, it is hereby agreed, and ordered as follows:

I. PRELIMINARY STATEMENT

- EPA initiated this proceeding for the assessment of a civil penalty, pursuant to Section 309 of the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1319.
- 2. The Complaint alleges that Respondent violated Sections 301 and 402 of the Act, 33 U.S.C. §§ 1311 and 1342, by failing to obtain National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit coverage for storm water discharges associated with industrial activities at its facility located in Guaynabo, Puerto Rico (Facility) and for its discharges of pollutants (stormwaters) into waters of the United States without NPDES permit coverage.

- 3. EPA notified the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico regarding this action and offered an opportunity for the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico to confer with EPA on the proposed penalty assessment, pursuant to 40 C.F.R. Part 22.
- 4. This action was public noticed. No public comment was received.
- On October 3, 2012, Respondent filed an answer to the Complaint, denying certain facts, admitting others, raising affirmative defenses and requesting a hearing in this matter.
- 6. This CA/FO shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent, its officers, directors, employees, successors and assigns, including, but not limited to, subsequent purchasers.
- 7. Respondent stipulates that EPA has jurisdiction over the subject matter alleged in the Complaint and that the Complaint states a claim upon which relief can be granted against Respondent. Respondent waives any defenses it might have as to jurisdiction and venue, and, without admitting or denying the factual or legal allegations contained in the Complaint, consents to the terms of this CA/FO.
- 8. Respondent hereby waives its right to a judicial or administrative hearing or appeal on any issue of law or fact set forth in the Complaint.

II. TERMS OF SETTLEMENT

- Pursuant to Section 309(g) of the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g), the nature of the violations and other relevant factors, EPA has determined that an appropriate civil penalty to settle this action is in the amount of FIFTY THOUSAND (\$50,000.00) DOLLARS.
- 10. For purposes of settlement, Respondent consents to the issuance of this Consent Agreement and consents to the payment of the civil penalty cited in the foregoing Paragraph.

II. A. Penalty

- 11. No later than sixty (60) days after the Effective Date of this Order, as defined in the Final Order (at the end of this document), Respondent shall pay an initial penalty of TWELVE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$12,500.00).
- 12. Thereafter, Respondent shall make 3 payments of TWELVE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$12,500.00) each, in accordance with the following schedule:

- a. the first of the 3 payments no later than the last day in the 5th month following the Effective Date;
- b. the second of the 3 payments no later than the last day of the 8th month following the Effective Date; and
- c. the third and final payment no later than the last day of the 11th month following the Effective Date.
- 13. Respondent shall pay the penalty of FIFTY THOUSAND (\$50,000.00) DOLLARS by cashiers' or certified checks, payable to the "Treasurer of the United States of America" or by wire transfers.
- 14. Respondent shall clearly identify, with either form of payment, the name and docket number of this case, set forth in the caption on the first page of this document.

Payments must be <u>received</u> at the above address as specified in paragraphs 11-12, above.

- c. Failure to pay the penalty in full according to the above provisions will result in a referral of this matter to the United States Department of Justice or the United States Department of the Treasury for collection.
- d. Further, if the payment is not received on or before the due date, interest will be assessed at the annual rate established by the Secretary of Treasury pursuant to the Debt Collection Act, 3I U.S.C. § 37I7, on the overdue amount from the due date through the date of payment. In addition, a late payment handling charge of \$15.00 will be assessed for each 30 day period (or any portion thereof) following the due date in which the balance remains unpaid. A 6% per annum penalty also will be applied on any principal amount not paid within 90 days of the due date.
- e. In addition, pursuant to Section 309(g)(9) of the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g)(9), if payment is not received by the due date, a quarterly nonpayment penalty will be imposed for each calendar quarter during which such nonpayment persists. The quarterly nonpayment penalty is 20% of the aggregate amount of penalties and quarterly nonpayment penalties which are unpaid as of the beginning of such quarter.
- f. Respondent also may be required to pay attorneys fees and costs for collection proceedings in connection with nonpayment.
- 15. The penalty to be paid is a civil penalty assessed by the EPA and shall not be deductible from the Respondents' federal or state taxes.

II. B. General Provisions

- 16. The Respondent waives any right it may have pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 22.8 to be present during discussions with or to be served with and to reply to any memorandum or communication addressed to the Director or the Regional Administrator where the purpose of such discussion, memorandum, or communication is to discuss a proposed settlement of this matter or to recommend that such official accept this Consent Agreement and issue the accompanying Final Order.
- 17. Nothing in this agreement shall be construed as prohibiting, altering or in any way limiting the ability of EPA to seek any other remedies or sanctions available by virtue of Respondent's violation of this agreement or of the statutes and regulations upon which this agreement is based, or for Respondent's violation of any applicable provision of law.



- 18. This CA/FO shall not relieve Respondent its obligation to comply with all applicable provisions of federal, state or local law, nor shall it be construed to be a ruling on, or determination of, any issue related to any federal, state or local permit.
- 19. This CA/FO constitutes a settlement by EPA of all claims for civil penalties pursuant to the Clean Water Act for the violations alleged in the Complaint. Nothing in this CA/FO is intended to nor shall be construed to operate in any way to resolve any criminal liability of the Respondent. Compliance with this CA/FO shall not be a defense to any actions subsequently commenced pursuant to Federal laws and regulations administered by EPA, and it is the responsibility of Respondent to comply with such laws and regulations.
- 20. Each undersigned representative of the parties to this Consent Agreement certifies that he or she is fully authorized by the party represented to enter into the terms and conditions of this Consent Agreement and to execute and legally bind that party to it.
- 21. Each party shall bear its own costs and attorney fees in connection with the action resolved by this CA/FO.
