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## Dear Mayor Cummings:

On September 28, 2010, the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued an Administrative Order, Docket No. SDWA-08-2010-0069, ordering the Town of Fairview (the Town or Respondent) to comply with various regulations issued by EPA under the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA), 42 U.S.C. section 300 f et seq.

Our records indicate that the Town of Fairview is in violation of the Order. Among other things, the Order included the following requirements (quoted from item 20 of the "Order" section on pages 4 and 5 of the Order):

1. Within 3 months of receipt of this Order (by January 1, 2011), Respondent shall submit an optimal corrosion control treatment recommendation and source water treatment recommendation to EPA and the State, including a schedule with milestone dates. 40 C.F.R. $\S \S 141.81(\mathrm{e})(1), 141.82$ and 141.83. Respondent shall complete installation of optimal corrosion control treatment or source water treatment (if applicable) within 18 months after the State and EPA approve the recommendation.

Respondent failed to submit an optimal corrosion control treatment recommendation and source water treatment recommendation (if applicable) to EPA and the State by January 1, 2011. On February 3, 2011, Keith Gustafson, Public Works Director, notified EPA that the Town is currently
working with Interstate Engineering to develop an optimal corrosion control treatment recommendation. Please notify EPA when its completion is expected.

EPA is considering additional enforcement action as a result of the noncompliance with the Order. Violating an Administrative Order may lead to (1) a penalty of up to $\$ 37,500$ per day per violation of the Order, and/or (2) a court injunction ordering compliance.
