Dear Mayor Thompson:

This is the Second Addendum to the Administrative Order (Order) issued to the Town of Cokeville (Town) on December 14, 2023. On January 22, 2024, the EPA issued the original Addendum which approved the Town's schedule for coming into compliance with 40 C.F.R. Part 141, Subparts H and T by permanently switching to an alternate source of water. On December 18, 2024, the Town proposed a revised plan and schedule after experiencing unanticipated delays. This letter serves as an approval of the Town's proposed schedule as revised (Schedule), which is hereby incorporated into the Order pursuant to paragraphs 21-22. Each milestone and deadline specified below is an enforceable provision of the Order.

Within 10 calendar days of completing all steps included in the above Schedule, please notify the EPA of the project's completion as required by the Order. The Order also requires the Respondent to achieve and maintain compliance with the requirements of 40 C.F.R. Part 141, Subparts H and T, by the final date specified in the approved Schedule. The EPA is authorized to seek penalties if these deadlines are not met. If the Town has a reasonable basis to believe it may be unable to meet any deadline in the Schedule, it must notify the EPA well in advance of the Scheduled deadline to request an extension. The EPA may, in its discretion, consider granting an extension.

As a reminder, you are required to provide the EPA with quarterly progress reports by the 10<sup>th</sup> calendar day of the month following each relevant quarter.
