Dear Chairman Chapoose:

Enclosed is an Emergency Administrative Order (Order) issued by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to the Ute Indian Tribe (Tribe) and the Ute Tribal Public Works (Public Works) under section 1431 of the Safe Drinking Water Act (Act), 42 U.S.C. § 300i.

The EPA has determined that conditions exist at the Uriah Heeps Spring Public Water System (System) that may present an imminent and substantial endangerment to the persons served by the System. The EPA has made this determination based on a notification from TriCounty Health Department Environmental Laboratory on August 12, 2021, that the System has *E. coli* and total coliform contamination, as described in the Order.

Pursuant to the authority set forth in section 1431 of the Act, 42 U.S.C. § 300i, the EPA is authorized to take actions necessary to protect human health. The Order and its requirements are necessary to ensure adequate protection of public health.

The enclosed Order sets forth the actions that must be taken to ensure that the people served by the System are provided with safe drinking water. The Order requires the Tribe and Public Works to, among other things, take the following actions: for the communities of Randlett and Ouray (and households in between), issue a boil water advisory and provide an alternate source of water until notified by the EPA to discontinue; submit a plan and schedule for corrective actions; disinfect and flush the System; and take additional total coliform bacteria samples.

The penalties for failing to comply are set forth in the Order.
