COMPLAINT

Jurisdiction

1. This is an administrative action for the assessment of civil penalties instituted pursuant to Section 309(g) of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, commonly referred to as the Clean Water Act (CWA), 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g), and in accordance with the Consolidated Rules of Practice Governing the Administrative Assessment of Civil Penalties and the Revocation/ Termination or Suspension of Permits, 40 C.F.R. Part 22.

2. This Complaint serves as notice that the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has reason to believe that Respondent has violated Sections 301 and 404 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1311 and § 1344, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

Parties

3. The authority to take action under Section 309(g) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g), is vested in the Administrator of EPA. The Administrator has delegated this authority to the Regional Administrator, EPA Region 7, who in turn has delegated it to the Director of the Water, Wetlands and Pesticides Division of EPA Region 7 (Complainant).

4. Respondent, Ken Petska, is a private individual residing at Highway 11, Elyria, Nebraska 68837.

Statutory and Regulatory Framework

5. Section 301 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1311, prohibits the discharge of “pollutants” by any “person” into “navigable waters,” as these terms are defined by Section 502 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1362, except in compliance with, *inter alia*, a permit issued pursuant to Section 404 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1344.

6. Section 404 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1344, specifically requires a person to obtain a permit from the Secretary of the Army acting through the Chief of Engineers, commonly referred to as the United States Army Corps of Engineers (hereinafter “Corps”), for any discharge of “dredged or fill material” into the “navigable waters” of the United States.

7. Section 502(7) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1362(7), defines “navigable waters,” in part, as the “waters of the United States,” which are defined at 40 C.F.R. § 232.2 and 33 C.F.R. Part 328, and which include intrastate rivers and streams, and tributaries thereto.

8. Section 309(g) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g), authorizes the commencement of an action for administrative penalties against any person who violates Section 404 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1344.

General Allegations

9. Respondent is a “person” as defined by Section 502(5) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1362(5).

10. At all times relevant to this action, Respondent Ken Petska operated or otherwise controlled the property located in the northwest quarter of Section 23, Township 20 North, Range 15 West in Valley County, Nebraska (“the Property”). The Property is adjacent to the North Loup River.

11. The dredged and/or fill materials discharged by Respondent into the North Loup River includes spoil, rock, sand and dirt and are “pollutants” within the meaning of Section 502(6) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1362(6).

12. The earth moving equipment, referenced in paragraph 16 below, constitutes a “point source” within the meaning of Section 502(14) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1362(14).

13. The discharge of the dredged and/or fill material into the North Loup River at the Property, described in paragraph 16 below, constitutes the “discharge of a pollutant” within the meaning of Section 501(12) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1362(12).

14. The North Loup River which flows into the Loup River, which flows into the Platte River, which flows into the Missouri River, are all “waters of the United States” within the

meaning of Section 502(7) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1362(7), 40 C.F.R. § 232.2 and 33 C.F.R. Part 328.

Count 1

Unpermitted Discharge

15. The facts stated in paragraphs 9 through 14 above are herein incorporated.

16. At various times between January 2004 and July 2005, the Respondent and/or persons acting on his behalf, discharged dredged or fill material including dirt, spoil, rock and sand, at the Property into an area in and adjacent to the North Loup River near Elyria, Valley County, Nebraska. The Respondent, using earth moving equipment, placed dredged or fill material in and around the river while trying to construct an access road from the river bank to an island in the North Loup River. These actions impacted approximately 1.5 acres of property within and adjacent to the river along approximately 1,000 feet of the river.

17. On June 29, 2006, the Corps inspected the Property and documented the discharges of fill material described in paragraph 16.

18. The discharge and disposal of dredged and/or fill material within the river has altered the natural flow of the North Loup River.

19. Respondent's discharge of pollutants from a point source into waters of the United States was performed without a permit issued pursuant to 404 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1344, and therefore these discharges violated Section 301 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1311.

20. Respondent did not obtain a permit issued pursuant to Section 404 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1344, prior to the performance of the work described herein, nor was the Respondent performing the work described herein under any prior permit issued pursuant to Section 404 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1344.

21. Respondent's discharge and disposal of pollutants from a point source into waters of the United States, as described above, occurred without a permit issued pursuant to Section 404 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1344, and, therefore, these discharges and disposals violated Section 301 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1311. The Respondent has not removed any of the fill material placed in waters of the United States and, therefore, the violations are continuing.

Relief

22. Section 309(g) (2) (B) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g) (2) (B), authorizes the administrative assessment of civil penalties in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 per day for each day during which the violation continues, up to a maximum total penalty of \$125,000. Under the Civil Monetary Inflation Rule, 40 C.F.R. Parts 19 and 27, civil administrative penalties of up to \$11,000 per day for each day during which a violation continues, up to a maximum of \$137,500,

may be assessed for violations of CWA Sections 301 and 404, 33 U.S.C. §§ 1311 and 1344, that occur after January 30, 1997.

23. Based on the foregoing Allegations, and pursuant to Section 309(g) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g), EPA Region 7 hereby proposes to issue a Final Order assessing an administrative penalty against the Respondent for the violation cited above, in an amount of Forty Thousand and Five Hundred dollars (\$40,500).

24. The proposed penalty is based upon the facts stated in this Complaint, the nature, circumstances, extent, and gravity of the violation, and with respect to the violator, ability to pay, any prior history of such violation, the degree of culpability, economic benefit or savings resulting from the violation, and such other matters as justice may require.

25. The penalty proposed in this Complaint is based upon the best information available to EPA at the time that the Complaint was issued. The penalty may be adjusted if the Respondent establishes bona fide issues of ability to pay, or other defenses relevant to the appropriate amount of the proposed penalty.

26. If Respondent does not contest the findings and assessments set forth above, Respondent may within thirty (30) days of receipt of this Complaint, make payment of the penalties assessed herein, remitted as follows:

Payment of the penalty - Forty Thousand and Five Hundred dollars \$40,500 - may be made by certified or cashier's check payable to "Treasurer, United States of America" and remitted to:

27. As required by Section 309(g) (4) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g)(4), prior to the assessment of a civil penalty, EPA will provide public notice of the proposed penalty, and reasonable opportunity for the public to comment on the matter, and present evidence in the event a hearing is held.

NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO REQUEST A HEARING

Answer and Request for Hearing

28. Respondent may request a hearing to contest any material fact contained in the Complaint above or to contest the appropriateness of the proposed penalty set forth therein. Such a hearing will be held and conducted in accordance with the Consolidated Rules of Practice Governing the Administrative Assessment of Civil Penalties and the Revocation/Termination or Suspension of Permits, 40 C.F.R. Part 22, a copy of which is enclosed herein.

29. To avoid being found in default, which constitutes an admission of all facts alleged in the Complaint and a waiver of the right to hearing, Respondent must file a written answer and request for hearing within thirty (30) days of service of this Complaint and Notice of Opportunity for Hearing. The answer shall clearly and directly admit, deny, or explain each of the factual allegations contained in this Complaint with respect to which Respondent has any knowledge, or shall clearly state that Respondent has no knowledge as to particular factual allegations in this Complaint. The answer shall also state (a) the circumstances or arguments which are alleged to constitute the grounds of defense; (b) the facts that Respondent disputes; (c) the basis for opposing any proposed relief; and (d) whether a hearing is requested. 30. Failure to admit, deny, or explain any material factual allegation in this Complaint constitutes an admission of the allegation.

31. A hearing upon the issues raised by this Complaint and the answer may be held if requested by Respondent in the answer. If Respondent does not request a hearing, the Presiding Officer may hold a hearing if issues appropriate for adjudication are raised in the answer.

32. In any hearing on the proposed penalty for this Complaint, members of the public to whom EPA is obligated to give notice of this proposed penalty action, will have the right, under Section 309(g) (4) (B) of CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g) (4) (B), to be heard and present evidence on the merits of the proposed CWA penalty assessment. If no hearing is held, EPA will issue a Final Order assessing administrative penalties pursuant to the CWA, and only members of the public who submitted timely comments on the proposed penalty assessment will have an additional thirty (30) days to petition to set aside the said Order and to hold a hearing thereon. EPA will grant the petition and will hold a hearing only if the petitioners' evidence is material and was not considered by EPA in the issuance of the Final Order.

33. If Respondent fails to file a written answer within thirty (30) days of service of this Complaint and Notice of Opportunity for Hearing, Respondent may be found in default. Such default by Respondent constitutes an admission of all facts alleged in the Complaint and a waiver of Respondent's right to contest such factual allegations. A Default Order may thereafter be issued by the Presiding Officer and the civil penalties proposed herein shall become due and payable unless the record clearly demonstrates that the requested relief is inconsistent with the CWA.

Informal Settlement Conference

34. Whether or not Respondent requests a hearing, an informal conference may be requested in order to discuss the facts of this case, the proposed penalty, and the possibility of settlement. To request a settlement conference, please contact:

35. Please note that a request for an informal settlement conference does not extend the thirty (30) day period during which a written answer and request for a hearing must be submitted.

36. EPA encourages all parties against whom a civil penalty is proposed to pursue the possibilities of settlement as a result of an informal conference. Any settlement which may be reached as a result of such a conference shall be embodied in a written Consent Agreement and Final Order issued by the Regional Judicial Officer, EPA Region 7. The issuance of such a Consent Agreement and Final Order shall constitute a waiver of Respondent's right to request a hearing on any matter stipulated therein.

37. If Respondent has not filed an answer within the thirty (30) day time period allowed by this Notice, the penalties proposed above may be assessed by the entry of a Default Order.
