Re: AMENDED NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Dear Mr. Bousfield:

The public water supply system referenced above (the system) has violated certain provisions of the National Primary Drinking Water Regulations at 40 C.F.R. part 141 (the drinking water regulations), according to records that the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has obtained from the Utah Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ).

On July 21, 2009, EPA issued a Notice of Violation, Docket No. SDWA-08-2009-0065, to the Utah Department of Environmental Quality (UDEQ or the State) for violations at the Dutch John public water system which include failure to submit a sampling schedule as required by the Long Term 2 Enhanced Surface Water Treatment Rule (LT2ESWTR), failure to monitor for *E. coli* as required by the LT2ESWTR, failure to provide public notice, and failure to notify the State of the violations. An additional violation for failure to monitor for lead and copper in 2008 has since been identified and therefore EPA is issuing this revised Notice of Violation to the UDEQ to include that violation.

EPA promulgated the drinking water regulations under the authority of the Safe Drinking Water Act (the Act), 42 U.S.C. § 300f et seq. EPA is issuing this notice of violation pursuant to section 1414(a) of the Act, 42 U.S.C. § 300g-3(a), which authorizes EPA to issue an administrative compliance order or file a lawsuit concerning the system if the State of Utah (the State) does not commence an appropriate enforcement action within thirty days of receiving this notice.


The violations are listed in the table below.

<u>Date of Violation</u>	<u>Violation</u>
July 1, 2008	Failure to submit a sampling schedule as required by the Long Term 2 Enhanced Surface Water Treatment Rule (LT2ESWTR) [40 C.F.R. § 141.702]
October 1, 2008 – July 6, 2009	Failure to monitor for <i>E. coli</i> as required by the LT2ESWTR. [40 C.F.R. § 141.701(c)]
2006 - 2008	Failure to monitor for lead and copper. [40 C.F.R. §§ 141.86]
2007 - 2009	Failure to notify public of various above-referenced violations. [40 C.F.R. §§ 141.203, 141.211]
2006 - 2009	Failure to report the above-referenced violations to the State. [40 C.F.R. §§ 141.21(g)(1) and 141.31(b)]


If the State does not commence an appropriate enforcement action concerning this system within 30 days from your receipt of the notification, EPA will likely issue an administrative order to the owner and/or operator of the system.
