#### Sonia:

Thank you for your time last week. I hope that this message finds you feeling better.

Per your request, EPA is providing you with records relevant to the alleged Clean Water Act violations. Attached to this message you will find two documents: 1) an infraction report from the Washington State Police illustrating that Mr. Slayden was issued a citation for violations associated with "improper lane usage" while operating the Chill Transportation LLC truck; and 2) an EPA pollution report summarizing the nature of the findings at the scene.

In the EPA pollution report, you will note a variety of findings that are relevant to EPA's alleged Clean Water Act violations. One issue that is *not* relevant to EPA's alleged Clean Water Act violations but is worth a brief explanation is Section 2.4.1 of the report titled "narrative." In that finance section, the report provides some preliminary estimated costs for oil spill assessment, response, and removal actions at the site. As emphasized in the section identified with an asterisk immediately below the table, these estimated costs were preliminary figures based on the understanding of the circumstances at the time of the finalization of this report (i.e., August 16, 2021). Since that time, the actual costs were updated but we understand they are still in the process of being finalized. For further discussion about that cost determination process and any questions about Chill Transportation LLC's obligations to reimburse the United States for those costs, please refer to the March 2, 2022 letter from the U.S. Coast Guard and contact U.S. Coast Guard Case Officer Steven Natale by phone at (202) 795-6087 or by email at: <a href="mailto:Steven\_J.Natale@uscg.mil">Steven\_J.Natale@uscg.mil</a>. As we explained during the call, the U.S. Coast Guard's process is separate and distinct from EPA's current administrative enforcement action.

Shortly after your receipt of this message, you will receive three separate emails with links to separate "Go Anywhere" web folders. Each of these web folders will contain relevant photographs that help to illustrate the discharge of oil into and upon waters of the United States and adjoining shorelines and discharges of pollutants into waters of the United States without a NPDES permit.

In order to access these web folders containing the photographs, you will simply click on the link in the Go Anywhere email message's blue box that says "Download Files." Here are some steps for your consideration.

- Before starting the download process, consider creating a new "destination" folder on your computer for these photos;
- When you click on the "Download Files" link, it will open up to the Go Anywhere folder with a "Mail" row with a "Download" button that allows you to combine and download all the photo files using the ZIP format;
- You can "save" that compressed or zipped file to your preferred folder destination; and finally,
- You can then click on the saved zipped file to unzip it (download it) to your preferred computer destination folder.

If you have any issues accessing the photographs using the Go Anywhere web folders, we can work with you to try to find an alternative approach for transmitting these photographs.

During our last conversation, you indicated that you would be providing EPA with relevant records for our review. **Please send those records to us as soon as possible**.

We would like to schedule a follow-up conversation with you to discuss the records that EPA has provided and discuss any records that you have provided to EPA. Rick and I are currently available during the following times and dates. Once you identify your preferred time and date, I will send a meeting invitation with the call-in information:

- Tuesday, April 19: 12:00PM 1:00PM Pacific Time and 2:00 3:00PM Pacific Time;

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On 08/08/2021, I was on duty in Yakima County. I was advised of a one semi rollover vehicle northbound on State Route 97 near milepost 57. Upon arrival, I observed a heavily damaged semi in a creek off the roadway. The semi was travelling north on State Route 97 and had gone through a guardrail, rolling and landing in a creek. The trailer was on its right side and the truck cab had seperated from the frame and came to rest approximately 75 feet north of the frame. The driver was trapped however was extracated and transported to the hospital. The driver was later identified with a California license as James Slayden.

Slayden at first stated that an animal ran across the roadway and then the next day changed it stating that someone attempted to pass him and cut him off. Based on road evidence, there was no braking or any evasive manevers. I could see tire marks in the gravel in shoulder prior to where the guardrail was struck all the way to where the guardrail was hit. The semi appeared to grind up against the guardrail before going over top of it and rolling the semi. I did not see any evidence of an attempt to correct back to his lane.

Had the semi remained within the guidelines of the lane, the collision would have been avoided.
