EXPEDITED SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND FINAL ORDER

1. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region 6 ("EPA") is authorized to enter into this Expedited Settlement Agreement ("Agreement") pursuant to Section 3008 of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act ("RCRA"), 42 U.S.C. § 6928 and 40 C.F.R. § 22.13(b).

2. By copy of this letter, EPA is providing the state of Louisiana with notice of the referenced violations of Subtitle C of RCRA as required by Section 3008(a)(2), 42 U.S.C. § 6928(a)(2).

3. Mike's Filter and Supply, Inc. ("Mike's Filter" or "Respondent") is the owner or operator of the facility at 2277 Denley Rd., Houma, LA 70363 (the "Facility"), EPA ID No. LAR000041269. EPA conducted a Compliance Inspection at the Facility on June 4, 2024. EPA alleges that Respondent violated the following requirements of the RCRA and the EPA approved and authorized Louisiana hazardous waste management programs:

a. Failure to meet the transfer facility requirements

Pursuant to Louisiana Admin. Code 33:V.1305.A, [40 C.F.R. § 263.12(a)], A transporter who stores manifested shipments of hazardous waste in containers

meeting the independent requirements of § 262.30 of this chapter at a transfer facility for a period of ten (10) days or less is not subject to regulation under parts 264, 265, 267, 268, and 270 of this chapter with respect to the storage of those wastes. During the inspection, the inspection team observed Mike's Filter stored hazardous waste for more than 10 days while operating as a transfer facility, in violation of 40 C.F.R. § 263.12(a).

b. Failure to meet the manifest system requirements

Pursuant to Louisiana Admin. Code 33:V.1307.B, [40 C.F.R. § 263.20(b)], Before transporting the hazardous waste, the transporter must sign and date the manifest acknowledging acceptance of the hazardous waste from the generator. The transporter must return a signed copy to the generator before leaving the generator's property. During the inspection, the inspection team observed Mike's Filter incorrectly dated hazardous waste manifests for shipments it transported, in violation of 40 C.F.R. § 263.20(b).

c. Failure to meet the labeling/marketing requirement for small quantity handlers of universal waste

Pursuant to Louisiana Admin. Code 33:V.3823.A.1, [40 C.F.R. § 273.14(a)], Universal waste batteries (i.e., each battery), or a container in which the batteries are contained, must be labeled or marked clearly with any one of the following phrases: "Universal Waste—Battery(ies)," or "Waste Battery(ies)," or "Used Battery(ies)". During the inspection, the inspection team observed Mike's Filter did not label a pallet of universal waste batteries as "Universal Waste—

Battery(ies),” or “Waste Battery(ies),” or “Used Battery(ies)”, in violation of 40 C.F.R. § 273.14(a).

d. Failure to meet the requirement of secondary containment for containers

Pursuant to Louisiana Admin. Code 33:V.4035.D.2, [40 C.F.R. § 279.45(d)(2)], The entire containment system, including walls and floors, must be sufficiently impervious to used oil to prevent any used oil released into the containment system from migrating out of the system to the soil, groundwater, or surface water. During the inspection, the concrete floor of Mike's Filter secondary containment system in the used oil transfer facility was not impervious, in violation of 40 C.F.R. § 279.45(d)(2).

4. EPA and Respondent agree that settlement of this matter for a civil penalty of \$7,500 is in public interest.

5. In signing this Agreement, Respondent: (1) admits that Respondent is subject to RCRA and its implementing regulations; (2) admits that EPA has jurisdiction over Respondent and Respondent's conduct as alleged herein; (3) neither admits nor denies the factual allegations contained herein; (4) consents to the assessment of this penalty; (5) waives the opportunity for a hearing to contest any issue of fact or law set forth herein; (6) waives its right to appeal the Final Order accompanying this Agreement pursuant to Section 3008(b) of RCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 6928(b); and (7) consents to electronic service of the filed ESA.

6. Within thirty (30) calendar days of the effective date of this Agreement, Respondent must pay the civil penalty of \$7,500 using any method provided on the following website: <https://www.epa.gov/financial/makepayment>. Such payment shall identify

Respondent by name and include the docket number assigned to this Agreement by the Regional Hearing Clerk.

7. Within 24 hours of payment, email proof of payment (e.g., confirmation of credit card or debit card payment, or confirmation of wire or automated clearinghouse transfer, and any other information required to demonstrate that payment has been made according to EPA requirements), including Respondent's name, complete address, and docket number to the following:

8. No portion of the civil penalty or interest paid by Respondent pursuant to the requirements of this Expedited Settlement and Final Order shall be claimed by Respondent as a deduction for federal, state or local income tax purposes.

9. By signing this Agreement, Respondent waives any rights or defenses that Respondent has or may have for this matter to be resolved in federal court, including but not limited to any right to a jury trial, and waives any right to challenge the lawfulness of the final order accompanying the Agreement.

10. By its signature below Respondent certifies, subject to civil and criminal penalties for making a false submission to the United States Government, that the alleged violations have

been corrected, and Respondent has submitted true and accurate documentation of such correction.

11. The undersigned representative of Respondent certifies that he or she is fully authorized to enter the terms and conditions of this Expedited Settlement Agreement and Final Order and to execute and legally bind Respondent to it. Upon the effective date of this Agreement, payment of the civil penalty shall constitute full settlement of the civil claims alleged herein.

12. Full payment of the civil penalty shall only resolve Respondent's liability for federal civil penalties for the violations alleged herein. EPA reserves all of its rights to take enforcement action for any other past, present, or future violations by Respondent of RCRA, any other federal statute or regulation, or this Agreement.

13. Each party shall bear its own costs and fees, if any.

14. This Agreement is binding on the parties signing below, and in accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 22.31(b), is effective upon filing.

15. This Agreement authorized by EPA's execution of the Final Order attached hereto constitutes a final order under 40 C.F.R. Part 22.

16. EPA and Respondent agree to the use of electronic signatures for this matter pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 22.6. The EPA and Respondent further agree to electronic service of this Agreement by email to the following:



Nothing in this Final Order shall be construed to waive, extinguish, or otherwise affect Respondents' (or its officers, agents, servants, employees, successors, or assigns) obligation to comply with all applicable federal, state, and local statutes and regulations, including the regulations that were the subject of this action.
