Dear Mr. Westberg:

On June 30, 2011, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued an Amended Administrative Order (Amended Order), ordering the Central Wyoming Council of Boy Scouts of America (the Council), as owner and/or operator of the Camp Buffalo Bill public water system, to comply with certain regulations promulgated under the federal Safe Drinking Water Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 300f to 300j-26. The EPA's records indicate that the Council is in violation of the Amended Order. Among other things, the Amended Order included the following requirement (quoted from item 11 on page 2 of the Amended Order, in which the Council is named as the respondent):

Respondent shall monitor the system's water during the 3rd quarter (July – September) for total coliform bacteria, as required by 40 C.F.R. § 141.21. Respondent shall report analytical results to EPA within the first 10 days following the month in which sample results were received, as required by the drinking water regulations. 40 C.F.R. § 141.31(a). Respondent shall report any violation of the total coliform monitoring requirements to EPA within 10 days after discovering the violation, as required by 40 C.F.R. § 141.21(g)(2).

The Council did not monitor the system's water for total coliform bacteria during the 3rd quarter (July – September) of 2012 and failed to report the noncompliance to EPA.

The EPA is considering additional enforcement action as a result of the Council's non-compliance with the Amended Order. Violating an administrative order may lead to (1) a penalty of up to \$37,500 per day per violation of the order, and/or (2) a court injunction ordering compliance.
