Dear Messrs. Day and Wolz:

On August 2, 2007, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued an Emergency Administrative Order (Order) under section 1431 of the Safe Drinking Water Act (the Act), 40 U.S.C. § 300i, to the Sleepy Hollow Homeowners Association, Inc. and Brett Wolz, owner and operator respectively of the Sleepy Hollow Subdivision public water system (the System). This letter confirms the verbal notice provided to you by Kimberly Pardue Welch of EPA on August 9, 2007 for reduced monitoring and recision of the public notification (boil order) and alternate water source requirements under the Order. Additionally, this letter serves as written notice that effective August 9, 2007, pursuant to the Order, daily bacteriological monitoring is no longer required and may be reduced to weekly monitoring. This notice is based on bacteriological monitoring conducted on August 3<sup>rd</sup>, August 4<sup>th</sup>, August 5<sup>th</sup>, August 6<sup>th</sup>, and August 7<sup>th</sup>, 2007 which were analyzed as total coliform negative. Weekly bacteriological monitoring shall be conducted until you are notified by EPA that sampling may be reduced to monthly. Additionally, you may discontinue the public notice required by the Order and may discontinue the provision of an alternative potable water supply. As an additional measure to ensure the protection of public health, the System is required to continue

daily monitoring of the chlorine residual at two locations in the distribution system until notified by EPA to discontinue the sampling. The system is required to comply with all other provisions of the Order. Penalties for failing to comply are set forth in the Order.
