Dear Mr. Moe:

The above-referenced Unilateral Administrative Order (UAO) was issued to the Solar Transport Company on June 23, 2008 regarding to your company's tanker truck rollover on June 11, 2008 at Milepost 200.5 on Highway 40, about 1.5 miles west of Hot Sulfur Springs, Grand County, Colorado (Site). Approximately 6,000 gallons of gasoline and diesel fuel were discharged and some of them reached the Colorado River which is a navigable water of United States. Under the UAO, your contractors had performed the Site stabilization and Removal Action according to the EPA approved Work Plan to mitigate the threat of continue oil release into the Colorado River.

As indicated in the Final Inspection Report dated October 19, 2009 which was submitted to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) by Burns & McDonnell, a final inspection was conducted by the EPA On-Scene Coordinator (OSC) on October 14, 2009 and subsequent actions were taken by your contractors on October 16, 2009 to fulfill the OSC's request. As a result, the U.S. EPA has determined that the threat of oil release to the Colorado River at the Site has been mitigated; Therefore, the U.S. EPA has concluded that the Solar Transport Company has complied satisfactorily with the terms of the UAO. Please consider this letter is a notice of completion of the Removal Action at the Site and EPA looks forward to receive your Final Completion Report soon.
