**ORDER SHORTENING RESPONSE TIME**

On January 4, 2023, Petitioner AMVAC Chemical Corporation filed a Motion for Production of Delegation Documents (“Motion”) seeking copies of various delegations of authority. The Motion suggests EPA has not decided whether it will oppose the document request.

Although the rules governing this proceeding typically provide a party 10 days to respond to a motion after being served, the rules also allow the response time to “be fixed by . . . the Administrative Law Judge[.]” 40 C.F.R. § 164.60(b). In this case, I find that a shorter response time is necessary given this proceeding’s current schedule.

Accordingly, EPA shall respond to AMVAC’s Motion no later than **Monday, January 9, 2023.**
