

**ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION OF
ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION PROCESS**


Complainant has filed an unopposed Motion to Extend Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) process for 30 days. The parties have narrowed the issues dividing each side to whether and how potential harm from the toxic chemical of concern should be dealt with in the context of a penalty for violations of Section 313 of EPCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 11023. Additionally, Complainant needs additional time to consider Judge Nissen's advisory opinion in regard to its settlement position. ADR expires on April 19, 2010. Accordingly, the time period provided for ADR is extended for 30 days to May 19, 2010.
