Subject: facility calls

Michelle:

Two things... first, a heads-up on an "error": Quad/Graphics in Lomira, Wisconsin (#1 increaser in waste for printing) had a BIG drop in on-site treatment of toluene in 1994. The '93 number was 41 million pounds and the '95 number was 56.2 million. TRIS shows no data for toluene in 1994 (MEK is the only chemical for which we find '94 data). This does not affect the '91 to '96 change but it does affect some of the industry-wide tables and figures. I spoke with a couple of their contacts. They claim to have sent forms for not only MEK AND toluene but also barium, xylene, and sulfuric acid in '94. The contact stated that these were mailed on 6/30/95. Yet, the only receipt acknowledgement he could find was for MEK. Still, he read 1994 toluene data to me over the phone:

- 8.1 207,000 pounds;
- 8.2 0;
- 8.3 93,000 pounds;
- 8.4 147,000;
- 8.5 0;
- 8.6 48,500,000;
- 8.7 10,000.

Second:

Six out of 12 facilities in printing are Quebecor plants. Four of these are ranked in production-related waste. I received a call late last week from the head of their corporate environmental office, Ann Pantle (pronounced pant' lee) that summarized a letter she planned to send to me in reference to our research. It may affect how we deal with the four facilities and could become a little problematic for us. The topics are the lack of definition of on-site recycling and use of the phrase "production-related waste." I asked her to direct the letter to you. She faxed me a

copy. I think she posted the original to you. I should fax it to you if this is the case. I briefed Catherine on this and faxed her a copy of the letter. I am holding off on the four Quebecor facilities that rank in waste (on-site recycling is the big issue) let me know when you want to talk about it. Call me if you haven't seen the letter and I will fax it to you.

I will send you another e-mail after lunch with more fun stuff (weekly status report).
