

Decorah Operations has implemented a robust recycling and reuse program for packaging materials. The recycling/reuse program addresses community needs through its use of a local organization for special needs adults to sort packaging materials for reuse.

Decorah Operations is the Lean model facility for the Rockwell Collins Lean Electronics Initiative, developed to eliminate all types of waste throughout the organization. While the initial focus of Lean Electronics was process changes (e.g., streamlining flow and throughput in the factory), no function or department is immune to undergoing evaluation for optimizing. Changes are made to satisfy financial business requirements, but have significant positive impacts on the environment, as well.
