2. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Eye contact: Immediately flush eyes with running water for at least 15 minutes, keeping eyelids open. Get medical attention.

Inhalation: If breathing is affected, remove to fresh air. Get medical attention.
