Notice of Public Comment Period for the  
Proposed Issuance of a Construction Permit and  
Revision of the Federally Enforceable State Operating Permit for  
C. E. Niehoff & Company in Evanston

C. E. Niehoff & Company has applied to the Illinois EPA for a construction permit to install new equipment including a degreaser, solvent still coater, dip tank and flux remover at its automotive parts manufacturing facility located at 2021 Lee Street in Evanston. The project would not be a major new source or modification for purposes of the federal rules for Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD), 40 CFR 52.21 or the state rules Major Stationary Sources Construction and Modification, 35 Ill. Adm. Code Part 203.

C. E. Niehoff & Company has also applied to revise its Federally Enforceable State Operating Permit (FESOP). The FESOP is being revised to incorporate the changes at the facility that would be allowed by the above referenced construction permit.

Based on its review of the applications, the Illinois EPA has made a preliminary determination that this project will comply with the applicable environmental regulations and has prepared draft construction and revised FESOP permits for public review.

The Illinois EPA is accepting comments prior to making a final decision on the applications for this project. **Comments must be postmarked by midnight October 2, 2010.** If sufficient interest is expressed in this matter, a hearing may be held. The 1990 amendments to the Clean Air Act require potentially major sources of air emissions to obtain federally enforceable operating permits. A FESOP allows a source that is potentially major to take operational limits in the permit so that it is a non-major source. The FESOP permit will contain federally enforceable limitations that restrict the facility's emissions to non-major levels. The FESOP permit will be enforceable by the USEPA, as well as the Illinois EPA.
