

Public Notice  
of the Proposed Revision of the Federally Enforceable State Operating Permit for  
Graphic Packaging Corporation in Centralia

Graphic Packaging Corporation has requested that the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency revise its federally enforceable state operating permit (FESOP) to incorporate the air emissions from the former J.D. Cahill Company, One Cahill Drive in Centralia, which was recently purchased by Graphic Packaging Corporation. The revised FESOP will cover operations at Graphic Packaging Corporation's operations at 2333 South Wabash Avenue and One Cahill Drive in Centralia. The plant at One Cahill Drive formerly had a lifetime operating permit from the Illinois EPA, but since the purchase of the facility by Graphic Packaging Corporation, the emissions from the two facilities are considered a single source. The 1990 amendments to the Clean Air Act require potentially major sources of air emissions to obtain federally enforceable operating permits. A FESOP permit allows a source that is potentially major to take operational limits in the permit so that it is a non-major source. The permit will contain federally enforceable limitations that restrict the facility's emissions to non-major levels. The permit will be enforceable by the USEPA, as well as the Illinois EPA. The Illinois EPA is accepting comments on the draft permit.

Comments are requested on the draft permit. Comments must be postmarked by midnight September 14, 2003. If sufficient interest is expressed in a permit, a hearing may be held.
