This permit is hereby granted to the above-designated Permittee to OPERATE emission unit(s) and/or air pollution control equipment consisting of ten stationary and thirty portable paint mixers, six paint can filling lines and ten solvent storage tanks pursuant to the above-referenced application. This Permit is subject to standard conditions attached hereto and the following special condition(s):

- 1a. This federally enforceable state operating permit is issued to limit the emissions of air pollutants from the source to less than major source thresholds (i.e., 25 tons/year for volatile organic material (VOM), 10 tons/year for a single hazardous air pollutant (HAP) and 25 tons/year for totaled HAP). As a result, the source is excluded from the requirements to obtain a Clean Air Act Permit Program (CAAPP) permit. The maximum emissions of this source, as limited by the conditions of this permit are described in Attachment A.
- b. Prior to issuance, a draft of this permit has undergone a public notice and comment period.
- c. This permit supersedes all operating permits issued for this location.
2. This permit is issued based upon the paint manufacturing operations not being subject to the requirements of 35 Ill. Adm. Code Part 218, Subpart AA: Paint and Ink Manufacturing per applicability criteria of Section 218.620(b). This is consequences of the potential emissions of VOM being limited to less than 25 tons/year through the federally enforceable conditions of this permit and solvent based paints production rate being less than 500,000 gallons per year.
3. Usage of raw materials and plant-wide VOM emissions from the paint manufacturing operations shall not exceed the following limits:

These limits define the potential emissions of VOM and are based on the actual emissions determined from the maximum production rate and standard emission factors. Compliance with annual limits shall be determined on a monthly basis from the sum of the data for the current month plus the preceding 11 months.

4. The emissions of HAPs as listed in Section 112(b) of the Clean Air Act shall not equal or exceed 10 tons per year of any single HAP or 25 tons per year of any combination of such HAPs, or such lesser quantity as USEPA may establish by rule which would require the Permittee to obtain a CAAPP permit from the Illinois EPA. As a result of this condition, this permit is issued based on the emissions of any HAP from this source not triggering the requirement to obtain a CAAPP permit from the Illinois EPA.
5. Operations and particulate matter emission from pigment handling shall not exceed the following limits:

These limits are based on the maximum production rate and standard emission factors for pigment handling given by AP-42. Compliance with annual limits shall be determined from a running total of 12 months of data.

6. The Permittee shall maintain monthly records of the following items:
 - a. Names and amount of solvents used (ton/mo; ton/yr);
 - b. VOM and HAP content in the solvents (wt. %);
 - c. VOM and HAP emission calculations (ton/mo; ton/yr).
7. All records and logs required by this permit shall be retained at a readily accessible location at the source for at least three years from the date of entry and shall be made available for inspection and copying by the Illinois EPA and USEPA upon request. Any records retained in an electronic format (e.g., computer) shall be capable of being retrieved and printed on paper during normal source office hours so as to be able to respond to an Illinois EPA request for records during the course of a source inspection.
8. If there is an exceedance of the requirements of this permit as determined by the record required by this permit, the Permittee shall submit a report to the Illinois EPA's Compliance Section in

Springfield, Illinois within 30 days after the exceedance. The report shall include the emissions released in accordance with the recordkeeping requirements, a copy of the relevant records, and a description of the exceedance or violation and efforts to reduce emissions and future occurrences.

9. The Permittee shall submit the following additional information with the Annual Emissions Report, due May 1st of each year:
 - a. Names and amount of solvents used (tons/yr) and their VOM and HAP content (wt. %) from the prior calendar year;
10. Two (2) copies of required reports and notifications concerning equipment operation or repairs, performance testing or a continuous monitoring system shall be sent to:

Attachment A - Emissions Summary

This attachment provides a summary of the maximum emission from the Paint Manufacturing Facility operating in compliance with the requirements of this federally enforceable permit. In preparing this summary, the Illinois EPA used the annual operating scenario which results in maximum emissions from such a plant. This is use of 500 tons of solvents (100% of VOM) in paint manufacturing per year. The resulting maximum emissions are well below the levels, e.g., 25 tons per year of VOM, 10 tons per year for a single HAP, and 25 tons per year for totaled HAP at which this source would be considered a major source for purposes of the Clean Air Act Permit Program. Actual emissions from this source will be less than predicted in this summary to the extent that material is handled, and control measures are more effective than required in this permit.

As a result of this condition, this permit is issued based on the emissions of any HAP from this source not triggering the requirement to obtain a Clean Air Act Permit Program permit from the Illinois EPA.
