Notice of Public Comment Period for the
Proposed Issuance of a Construction Permit and
Federally Enforceable State Operating Permit for
Marathon Petroleum Company LLC in Hartford

Marathon Petroleum Company LLC, 539 South Main Street, Findlay, Ohio, 45840, has applied to the Illinois EPA for an air pollution control construction permit to modify the tank truck loading rack and six storage tanks at its petroleum terminal located at 1402 South Delmar in Hartford. The modifications would allow increased throughput at the loading rack and storage tanks and would allow the uncontrolled loading of distillate products and addition of backup portable control devices at the loading rack. The modification would also increase the permitted emission limits from the loading rack and storage tanks. The project would not be a major new source or modification of air emissions as defined by the federal Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) rules, 40 CFR 52.21 or the state rules, Major Stationary Sources Construction and Modification (MSSCAM), 35 IAC Part 203.

Marathon has also requested that the Illinois EPA issue a Federally Enforceable State Operating Permit (FESOP) for the terminal facility. The 1990 amendments to the Clean Air Act require potentially major sources of air emissions to obtain federally enforceable operating permits. A FESOP allows a source that is potentially major to take operational limits in the permit so that it is a non-major source. The permit will contain federally enforceable limitations that restrict the facility's emissions to non-major levels. The permit will be enforceable by the USEPA, as well as the Illinois EPA. The FESOP would include the changes requested in the draft construction permit.

Based on its review of the applications, the Illinois EPA has made a preliminary determination that the applications will comply with the applicable environmental regulations and has prepared draft permits for public review.

The Illinois EPA is accepting comments on the draft permits. Comments must be postmarked by midnight July 31, 2009. If sufficient interest is expressed in a permit, a hearing may be held.
