Notice of Public Comment Period for the
Proposed Issuance of a Construction Permit and
Issuance of a Federally Enforceable State Operating Permit for
GSI Technologies, Inc. in Burr Ridge

GSI Technologies, Inc. has applied to the Illinois EPA for a construction permit for its printing plant located at 311 Shore Drive in Burr Ridge. The construction permit would allow the facility to add a new printing line, modify an existing printing line and add new cleaning equipment for another print line. The project would not be a major new source or modification for purposes of the federal rules for Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD), 40 CFR 52.21 or the state rules Major Stationary Sources Construction and Modification, 35 Ill. Adm. Code Part 203.

GSI Technologies, Inc. has also applied for a Federally Enforceable State Operating Permit (FESOP) for the facility. The FESOP is the operating permit for the facility and would contain federally enforceable conditions limiting air emissions from the facility.

Based on its review of the applications, the Illinois EPA has made a preliminary determination that this project will comply with the applicable environmental regulations and has prepared draft construction and FESOP permits for public review.

The Illinois EPA is accepting comments prior to making a final decision on the applications for this project. **Comments must be postmarked by midnight December 3, 2010.** If sufficient interest is expressed in this matter, a hearing may be held. The 1990 amendments to the Clean Air Act require potentially major sources of air emissions to obtain federally enforceable operating permits. A FESOP allows a source that is potentially major to take operational limits in the permit so that it is a non-major source. The FESOP permit will contain federally enforceable limitations that restrict the facility's emissions to non-major levels. The FESOP permit will be enforceable by the USEPA, as well as the Illinois EPA.
