Proposed Issuance of a Clean Air Act Permit Program Permit to  
Tower Automotive Products, Inc. in Chicago

Tower Automotive Products, Inc., 2934 East 126th Street, Chicago, Illinois 60633, has requested a Clean Air Act Permit Program (CAAPP) permit from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Illinois EPA) to regulate air emissions from its automotive products assembly operations located at 12350 South Avenue O in Chicago. For purposes of the CAAPP, Tower Automotive Products Company, Inc. is considered a single source with Ford Motor Company - Chicago Assembly Plant, I.D. No. 031600AAR, located at 12600 South Torrence Avenue, Chicago.

The Illinois EPA is accepting comments on the draft permit. Comments must be postmarked by midnight April 13, 2007. If sufficient interest is expressed in a permit, a hearing may be held. The CAAPP is Illinois' operating permit program for major sources of emissions, as required by Title V of the Clean Air Act (Act). The conditions of CAAPP permits are enforceable by the public, as well as by the USEPA and Illinois EPA. In addition to implementing Title V of the Act, CAAPP permits may contain "Title I Conditions," i.e., conditions established under the permit programs for new and modified emission units, pursuant to Title I of the Act. There are Title I provisions (denoted as T1) in this permit. The T1 conditions are found in Condition 7.1.6 and incorporate limits established in construction permit 03010072. There are no new or revised T1 conditions in the permit.
