Proposed Issuance of Clean Air Act Permit Program Permit to  
PMP Fermentation Products, Inc., Peoria

PMP Fermentation Products, Inc., has requested a Clean Air Act Permit Program (CAAPP) permit from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Illinois EPA) for its facility located at 121 Wayne Street in Peoria. The CAAPP permit will be enforceable by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, as well as the Illinois EPA. The Illinois EPA is accepting comments on the draft permit.

The Illinois EPA has reviewed the permit application and has concluded that the application complies with applicable state and federal air pollution control laws and rules, including the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, the federal Clean Air Act, and Illinois' Rules for Air Pollution (35 Ill. Adm. Code: Subtitle B).
