This permit is hereby granted to the above-designated Permittee to OPERATE emission source(s) and/or air pollution control equipment consisting of two natural gas-fired boilers pursuant to the above-referenced application. This Permit is subject to standard conditions attached hereto and the following special condition(s):

- 1a. This permit shall expire 180 days after the Illinois EPA sends a written request for the renewal of this permit.
- b. This permit shall terminate if it is withdrawn or is superseded by a revised permit.
- 2a. The Boiler #7 is subject to New Source Performance Standards (NSPS) for small Industrial-Commercial-Institutional Steam Generating Units, 40 CFR 60, Subparts A and Dc. The Illinois EPA is administering these standards in Illinois on behalf of the United States EPA under a delegation agreement.
- b. The Permittee shall fulfill applicable reporting and recordkeeping requirements of 40 CFR 60.48(c).
- c. At all times the Permittee shall, to the extent practicable, maintain and operate the boiler, including associated air pollution control equipment, in a manner consistent with good air pollution control practice for minimizing emissions.
3. Operation and emissions of the boilers (combined) shall not exceed the following limits:

Natural Gas Usage: 76 mmscf/mo, 870 mmscf/yr

Nitrogen Oxides (NO _x)	100	3.8	43.5

Volatile Organic Materials (VOM)	5.5	0.2	2.4

These limits are based on the maximum boilers operations and standard emission factors given by AP-42. Compliance with annual limits shall be determined on a monthly basis from a running total of 12 months of data.

4. The Permittee shall maintain monthly records of the following items:
 - a. Natural gas usage (mmscf/month and mmscf/year);
5. All records and logs required by this permit shall be completed by the last day of the month following the reported month and retained at a readily accessible location at the source for at least three years from the date of entry and shall be made available for inspection and copying by the Illinois EPA or USEPA upon request. Any records retained in an electronic format (e.g., computer) shall be capable of being retrieved and printed on paper during normal source office hours so as to be able to respond to the Illinois EPA or USEPA request for records during the course of a source inspection.
6. If there is an exceedance of the requirements of this permit as determined by the records required by this permit, the Permittee shall submit a report to the Illinois EPA Compliance Section in Springfield, Illinois within 30 days after the exceedance. The report shall include the emissions released in accordance with the recordkeeping requirements, a copy of the relevant records, and a description of the exceedance or violation and efforts to reduce emissions and future occurrences.
7. Two (2) copies of required reports and notifications concerning equipment operation or repairs, performance testing or a continuous monitoring system shall be sent to:

8. Persons with lifetime operating permit must obtain a revised permit to any of the following changes at the source:

- a. An increase in emissions above the amount the emission unit or the source is permitted to emit;
- b. A modification;
- c. A change in operation that will result in the source's noncompliance with a condition in the existing permit;

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- d. A change in ownership, company name, or address, so that the application or existing permit is no longer accurate.
