Proposed Issuance of Clean Air Act Permit Program Permit to  
Grace Division in Chicago

Grace Division has requested a Clean Air Act Permit Program (CAAPP) permit from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Illinois EPA) for air emissions from the inorganic chemical processing facility located at 4099 West 71<sup>st</sup> Street in Chicago. Major sources of air emissions are required by the 1990 Amendments to the Clean Air Act to obtain Title V permits. The permit will be enforceable by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, as well as the Illinois EPA. The beginning of this public comment period also serves as the beginning date of the USEPA 45 day review period, provided the USEPA does not seek a separate proposed period. This permit may contain terms and conditions established pursuant to Title I of the federal Clean Air Act thereby making them combined Title V and Title I permits. The Illinois EPA is accepting comments on the draft permit.

Comments are requested on the proposed issuance of the permit. Comments must be postmarked by midnight January 11, 2003. If sufficient interest is expressed in a permit, a hearing may be held.
