This permit is hereby granted to the above-designated Permittee to OPERATE emission unit(s) and/or air pollution control equipment consisting of 3 paint booths, parts washer and 4 dip tanks pursuant to the above-referenced application. This Permit is subject to standard conditions attached hereto and the following special condition(s):

- 1a. This federally enforceable state operating permit is issued to limit the emissions of air pollutants from the source to less than major source thresholds (i.e., volatile organic material (VOM), single hazardous air pollutants (HAP), and combined hazardous air pollutants (HAPs), 100, 10, and 25, respectively). As a result the source is excluded from the requirement to obtain a Clean Air Act Permit Program (CAAPP) permit. The maximum emissions of this source, as limited by the conditions of this permit, are described in Attachment A.
  - b. Prior to issuance, a draft of this permit has undergone a public notice and comment period.
  - c. This permit supersedes all operating permits issued for this location.
2. The emissions of Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs) as listed in Section 112(b) of the Clean Air Act shall not equal or exceed 10 tons per year of any single HAP or 25 tons per year of any combination of such HAPs, or such lesser quantity as USEPA may establish in rule which would require the Permittee to obtain a CAAPP permit from the Illinois EPA. As a result of this condition, this permit is issued based on the emissions of any HAP from this source not triggering the requirement to obtain a CAAPP permit from the Illinois EPA.

- 3a. Emissions and operation of painting operations shall not exceed the following limits:

These limits are based on complete volatilization of the VOM content in the coatings. Compliance with annual limits shall be determined from a running total of 12 months of data.

- b. All coatings must comply with 215.204(j).
- c. This permit is issued based on negligible emissions of particulate matter from 3 spray booths and parts washer. For this purpose, emissions from each source shall not exceed nominal emission rates of 0.1 lb/hour and 0.44 ton/year.
4. The Permittee shall maintain monthly and annual records of the following:
- a. Usage (gal/mo, gal/yr), VOM and HAP content (% wt. and/or lb/gal), and VOM and HAP emissions (lb/mo, ton/yr) of the following coatings:
    - i. Paints
    - ii. Clean-Up Solvents
    - iii. All Other Coatings
5. All records and logs required by this permit shall be retained at a readily accessible location at the source for at least three years from the date of entry and shall be made available for inspection and copying by the Illinois EPA or USEPA upon request. Any records retained in an electronic format (e.g., computer) shall be capable of being retrieved and printed on paper during normal source office hours so as to be able to respond to an Illinois EPA or USEPA request for records during the course of a source inspection.
6. If there is an exceedance of the requirements of this permit as determined by the records required by this permit, the Permittee shall submit a report to the Illinois EPA's Compliance Section in Springfield, Illinois within 30 days after the exceedance. The report shall include the emissions released in accordance with the recordkeeping requirements, a copy of the relevant records, and a description of the exceedance or violation and efforts to reduce emissions and future occurrences.

7. Two (2) copies of required reports and notifications concerning equipment operation or repairs, performance testing or a continuous monitoring system shall be sent to:

8. The Permittee shall submit the following additional information with the Annual Emissions Report, due May 1st of each year: paint and solvent usage.

It should be noted that the 4 gas fired ovens/dryers and small gas-fired heaters are exempt from permitting pursuant to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 201.146(ff) and (d), respectively, and potential to emit from these sources combined is less than 0.7 tons/year of VOM.

Attachment A - Emission Summary

This attachment provides a summary of the maximum emissions from paint spray booth operating in compliance with the requirements of this federally enforceable permit. In preparing this summary, the Illinois EPA used the annual operating scenario which results in maximum emissions from such a plant. Annual paint usage totals 16,000 gallons and an annual clean-up solvent usage of 3,000 gallons. The resulting maximum emissions are well below the levels, e.g., VOM emissions 100 tons/yr, single HAP, 10 tons/yr, and total combined HAPs, 25 tons/yr at which this source would be considered a major source for purposes of the Clean Air Act Permit Program. Actual emissions from this source will be less than predicted in this summary to the extent that less material is handled and control measures are more effective than required in this permit.

1. The emissions of Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs) as listed in Section 112(b) of the Clean Air Act shall not equal or exceed 10 tons per year of any single HAP or 25 tons per year of any combination of such HAPs, or such lesser quantity as USEPA may establish in rule which would require the Permittee to obtain a CAAPP permit from the Illinois EPA. As a result of this condition, this permit is issued based on the emissions of any HAP from this source not triggering the requirement to obtain a CAAPP permit from the Illinois EPA.
