Proposed Issuance of a Clean Air Act Permit Program (Title V) Permit and
a State Construction Permit to
ITT Bell and Gossett, Morton Grove

ITT Bell and Gossett has requested a Clean Air Act Permit Program (CAAPP) permit from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Illinois EPA) for its industrial pump manufacturing facility located at 8200 North Austin Avenue in Morton Grove. Because the company is planning to add a new paint spray booth, they must also obtain a state construction permit. The conditions of the construction permit have been incorporated into the CAAPP permit. The Illinois EPA is accepting comments on the proposed permits.

The CAAPP permit will be enforceable by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, as well as the Illinois EPA. The beginning of this public comment period also serves as the beginning date of the USEPA 45 day review period, provided the USEPA does not seek a separate proposed period. This permit may contain terms and conditions established pursuant to Title I of the federal Clean Air Act thereby making it a combined CAAPP and Title I permit.

The company must obtain a state construction permit for the addition of the paint spray booth. The contemporaneous increase in volatile organic material (VOM) emissions from the new paint spray booth would not be major, so the construction is not subject to Major Stationary Source Construction and Modification, 35 IAC Part 203.

Comments are requested on the proposed issuance of the permit. Comments must be postmarked by midnight September 24, 2000. If sufficient interest is expressed in a permit, a hearing may be held.
