

Public Notice
of the Proposed Issuance of a Federally Enforceable State Operating Permit (FESOP) to
National Container Service, Chicago

National Container Service has requested that the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency issue a federally enforceable state operating permit (FESOP) for air emissions from the plastic drum reconditioning facility located at 3620 West 38th Street in Chicago. Under the 1990 amendments to the Clean Air Act, the facility is required to obtain a federally enforceable permit for its air emissions. The permit will contain federally enforceable limitations that restrict the facility's emissions to non-major levels. The permit will be enforceable by the USEPA, as well as the Illinois EPA. The Illinois EPA is accepting comments on the permit.

Comments are requested on the draft permit. Comments must be postmarked by midnight March 2, 2002. If sufficient interest is expressed in the permit, a hearing may be held.
