Proposed Issuance of Clean Air Act Permit Program Permits to  
the University of Illinois at Chicago

University of Illinois at Chicago has requested Clean Air Act Permit Program (“CAAPP” or “Title V”) permits from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Illinois EPA) for air emissions from its east and west campuses located at 1140 South Morgan Street in Chicago. Although the Illinois EPA is issuing separate permits for the east and west campuses, the two campuses are considered a single source for CAAPP applicability. As a major source of air emissions, the university is required by the 1990 Amendments to the Clean Air Act to obtain Title V permits. The permits will be enforceable by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, as well as the Illinois EPA. The beginning of this public comment period also serves as the beginning date of the USEPA 45 day review period, provided the USEPA does not seek a separate proposed period. The permits may contain terms and conditions established pursuant to Title I of the federal Clean Air Act thereby making them combined Title V and Title I permits. The Illinois EPA is accepting comments on the draft permits.

Comments are requested on the proposed issuance of the permits. Comments must be postmarked by midnight May 25, 2002. If sufficient interest is expressed in a permit, a hearing may be held.
