

Public Notice
of the Proposed Revision of the Federally Enforceable State Operating Permit for
Clarín in Lake Bluff

Clarín, a division of Greenwich Industries, L.P., has requested that the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency revise its federally enforceable state operating permit (FESOP) for its facility located at 927 North Shore Drive in Lake Bluff. The revision would allow for an increase in the amount of cleanup solvent used and flexibility in the type of solvent used.

The 1990 amendments to the Clean Air Act require potentially major sources of air emissions to obtain federally enforceable operating permits. A FESOP permit allows a source that is potentially major to take operational limits in the permit so that it is a non-major source. The permit will contain federally enforceable limitations that restrict the facility's emissions to non-major levels. The permit will be enforceable by the USEPA, as well as the Illinois EPA. The Illinois EPA is accepting comments on the draft permit.

Comments are requested on the draft permit. Comments must be postmarked by midnight September 28, 2003. If sufficient interest is expressed in a permit, a hearing may be held.
