Proposed Modification of the Clean Air Act Permit Program (Title V) Permit for
Berlin Industries, Inc., Carol Stream

Berlin Industries, Inc. has requested a significant modification to its Clean Air Act Permit Program (CAAPP) permit issued by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency for its printing facility located at 175 Mercedes Drive in Carol Stream. As a major source of air emissions, the facility is required by the 1990 Amendments to the Clean Air Act to have a CAAPP permit. The modifications include removal of material usage and volatile organic material content limits in Condition 7.1.6(a) and the incorporation of a construction permit issued to the company in December 2000. A complete list of the modifications to the permit is listed at the front of the permit. The permit will be enforceable by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, as well as the Illinois EPA. The beginning of this public comment period also serves as the beginning date of the USEPA 45 day review period, provided the USEPA does not seek a separate proposed period. This permit may contain terms and conditions established pursuant to Title I of the federal Clean Air Act thereby making it a combined CAAPP and Title I permit. The Illinois EPA is accepting comments on the draft permit.

Comments are requested on the proposed issuance of the modifications. Comments must be postmarked by midnight March 16, 2002. If sufficient interest is expressed in the permit, a hearing may be held.
