Dear Mr. Rickun:

This letter is in reply to your October 21, 2008, letter regarding the Clean Air Act (CAA) permitting requirements for the proposed 410 kilowatt stand-by generator at the Forest County Potawatomi (FCP) Community Health and Wellness Center, 5409 Everybody's Road, Crandon, Wisconsin. Based on the information provided in your letter and the November 12, 2008, telephone conversation between you and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region 5 air permit staff, EPA agrees that the project will not require that you obtain a permit under the Federal Prevention of Significant Deterioration construction permitting program or the Federal Title V operating permit program.

The FCP Community Health and Wellness Center is located on Federal trust land within the exterior boundaries of the FCP reservation. As part of EPA's trust responsibility to Indian tribes, EPA would be the permitting authority for sources requiring permits under the CAA. The proposed generator's projected uncontrolled potential emissions of regulated air pollutants, as well as emissions from the Health and Wellness Center facility, itself, fall below the significance threshold level for permit applicability.

If there are any future modifications at the facility which would affect air emissions, please contact us to confirm the permitting status of the facility. If you have any further questions, please feel free to contact Constantine Blathras, of my staff, at (312) 886-0671.
