
Dear Mr. Paul:

U. S. Environmental Protection Agency offers the following comments on the Regional Air Pollution Control Agency (RAPCA) Fiscal Year (FY) 2008 end-of-year air pollution control activities as contained in RAPCA's program plan.

The RAPCA has effectively managed its air quality control program. Specifically, administrative reports have been submitted in a timely manner, and applicable programmatic terms and conditions have been met.

RAPCA has inputted the required data in the State's Compliance and Enforcement Tracking Application (CETA). OEPA's Central Office has the responsibility to ensure that data from CETA is uploaded to Air Facility System (AFS) in a timely manner.

RAPCA does report that they have met or are meeting the commitments for the Industrial Permitting/Inspections/Enforcement portion of the projected program activity for FY 2008. A review of the data from the AFS supports RAPCA's statements that all commitments have been met.

RAPCA is the only local Ohio air agency that submits its own data to Air Quality System (AQS). RAPCA is always timely in their data submittals and always send one or more representatives to EPA's annual AQS conference.
