The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has completed its review of the application for a Minor New Source Review (NSR) Permit to Construct for Prestige Custom Cabinetry, Inc. in Green Bay, Wisconsin, located on the Oneida Indian reservation. The application was received by EPA on November 19, 2013.

Today EPA is sending you this letter to document EPA's completeness determination, to remind Prestige Custom Cabinetry, Inc. of its continuing obligation to correct any misinformation and provide updated information to EPA, and of its continuing obligation to comply with applicable EPA permitting and regulatory requirements.

Completeness Determination: Pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 49.154 (b) 1-3, we have determined that the information submitted in the application is administratively complete. We will issue or deny your permit no later than 135 days after the date the application is deemed complete and all additional information necessary to make an informed decision has been provided.

Duty to Provide Additional Information: Please be advised that this application completeness determination does not constitute a thorough evaluation of the merits of the application. If we determine that additional information is necessary to evaluate the application or to take final action on it, we may request such information in writing and set a reasonable deadline for a response. (See 40 § C.F.R. 49.154(b)(2).)

Please remember this completeness determination does not cover future changes at the facility for construction permitting purposes, future changes may necessitate a new application.
