Dear Ms. Bozzer:

I am writing in response to your letters of December 16, 2015, and March 7, 2016 regarding Summit Petroleum Corporation's (Summit) Part 49 synthetic minor construction permit (SYN-IS-IN1617-2014-01) issued August 19, 2015, and effective September 20, 2015. In your letters you state that Summit has ceased operations at its Rosebush, Michigan plant and at the two adjacent oil wells covered by this permit. You informed us that Summit has no plans to restart the plant and requested that, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency revoke Summit's permit.

The regulations at 40 C.F.R. § 49.160(d)(3) require a source to submit a report of closure to the reviewing authority in writing within 90 days after the cessation of all operations at the source. At this time, EPA does not have a standardized form for reporting facility closure. In light of the information you provided in your March 7, 2016 letter which described the complete cessation of air pollutant emitting operations following the dismantling and sale of all plant and field equipment, we have determined that Summit is no longer subject to the permitting requirements specified in the Part 49 construction permit.

If Summit or another entity wishes to restart operations at this site, a new construction permit application would be required before any construction and operation activities were to occur.
