NOTICE OF INTENT TO ISSUE A DRAFT CLEAN AIR ACT PART 71 PERMIT TO OPERATE FOR TREASURE ISLAND RESORT & CASINO

The U. S. Environmental Protection Agency requests public comment on the draft Air Pollution Control Title V Permit to Operate (Permit No. V-PI-2704900084-2012-13) for NRG Reliability Solutions, LLC, 17685 Juniper Path, Suite 301, Lakeville, Minnesota. The draft permit would authorize NRG Reliability Solutions, LLC to operate emissions units at Treasure Island Resort & Casino located at 5734 Sturgeon Lake Road, Red Wing, Minnesota. The public comment period for the draft permit ends January 12, 2017.

NRG Reliability Solutions, LLC owns and operates four diesel-fired generators at Treasure Island Resort & Casino. Each generator is a limited use stationary reciprocating internal combustion engine as defined in 40 C.F.R. Part 63 Subpart ZZZZ. Once issued, this permit would authorize subsequent carbon monoxide performance tests for each limited use stationary reciprocating internal combustion engine required by 40 C.F.R. Part 63 Subpart ZZZZ to occur once every five years or 8,760 hours, whichever occurs first.

Written comments may be sent to Edward Nam, Acting Director, Air and Radiation Division (A-18J), at the above EPA Region 5 office address, or online at <https://www.regulations.gov> under Docket ID No. EPA-R05-OAR-2016-0722 by January 12, 2017. All written comments should include the reason for interest in the draft permit, requested actions for EPA to take, and the justification for such actions. All comments should include sufficient specificity and regulatory references to allow EPA to investigate the merits of the position.

If you do not want to comment at this time, but would like to receive notice of future action related to this permit application, contact EPA Region 5 at the address listed above.

Members of the public may also request a public hearing. A request for a public hearing must be made in writing and must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised at the hearing. Written requests for a public hearing should be sent to the EPA Region 5 address listed above.

All relevant comments received prior to the end of the public comment period will be considered in arriving at a final decision on the permit. All comments will be included in the public docket without change and may be made available to the public, including any personal information provided, unless the comment includes Confidential Business Information (CBI) or other information whose disclosure is restricted by statute. Information that you consider CBI or otherwise protected should be clearly identified as such and should not be submitted through e-mail. If you send e-mail directly to EPA, your e-mail address will be captured automatically and included as part of the public comment. Please note that an e-mail or postal address must be provided with your comments if you wish to receive direct notification of EPA's final decision regarding the permit and its responses to comments submitted during the public comment period. The final permit is a public record that can be obtained upon request. A statement of reasons for changes made to the draft permit and responses to comments received will be sent to all persons who commented on the draft permit. If you believe any condition of the draft permit is inappropriate or that our initial decision to deny an application, terminate a permit, or prepare a draft permit is inappropriate, you must raise all reasonably ascertainable issues and submit all reasonably ascertainable arguments supporting your position by the end of the comment period.
